#### HALL EXHIBITS

Rules and Regulations NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS: Please read regulations here and those printed in each class carefully and be prepared to comply with the requirements. Make sure to complete an entry form in order to enter your items and receive entry tags.


- 1. Hall Exhibits will be displayed in the Jack Williamson Memorial Ag Plex.
- 2. Entry fees are \$1.00 per entry to be paid to the Valleyview & Districts Agricultural Society.
- 3. Junior exhibitors must be 16 years old & under; please state age on entry tag in order to assist judges' decisions. Juniors may exhibit in Adult Classes as noted in that class.
- 4. All entries must be on the appropriate forms and given to the Cashiers between Noon & 8pm on Thursday August 10th and 9am and noon on Friday August 11th. No late entries will be accepted to avoid chaos on judging day.
- 5. There will be no refunds of hall exhibit entry fees.
- Entry tags will be available at the office prior to entry dates and also at the Ag Plex on entry days. Entry tags must be filled in completely and securely attached to all articles by the exhibitor prior to display. This is to hasten the placement and lessen the confusion.
- 7. Proper class and section placement is the responsibility of each entrant (articles entered wrongly will be disqualified).
- 8. Only one entry per person is permitted in each section unless otherwise stated.
- 9. All entries must be wholly the work of the exhibitor and entered under his/her own name. Previously exhibited articles are not eligible to compete again.
- 10. Hall Exhibits will be closed to everyone except the show committee members at 1:00 pm, Friday August 11th, 2023, and will re-open at 4:00pm to 8:00pm to spectators. Exhibitors may also pick up their winnings. The Valleyview and Districts Agricultural Society will take the greatest care with Exhibits, but will not be responsible for breakage, loss or damage of any exhibit.
- 11. Prize money and Exhibits must be claimed no later than between 4:00pm & 5:00pm Sunday August 13th, 2023.


#### **GRAINS & GRASSES**

Rules: All sheaves must be 2.5-3" (6-8cm) at the neck. Tied in 3 places with a ribbon or tape, no twine. Baled Hay: 8-9" (20-23cm) thick slice of the square bale, neatly tied and wrapped in clear plastic. Pints of Grain: Even size, no discoloration or peeled. No weeds, insects damage or treated grain. Must be 2022/23 crop and not entered before (sample will be discarded at the close of the show).
