ORDINANCE NO. 50.

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING LICENSES AND REPEALING ALL OTHER ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE INCORPORATED TOWN OF SUGAR CITY, COLORADO:

Section 1: No person shall, within the limits of the town of Sugar City, conduct, carry on, or pursue, or engage in any business or avocation in this ordinance named, without first being licensed therefor, and shall pay for such license the sums hereinafter specified, to-wit:

First-Street hawkers, \$ 5.00 per day.

Second-Peddlers and solicitors, \$ 3.00 per day.

Third-Shooting gallery \$ 2.00 per day, \$ 5.00 per week, or \$ 10.00 per month.

Fourth-Phonographs, cane racks, striking machines, lifting machines, exhibitions on the street, or other amusements on or adjacent to the street not herein enumerated; in all cases where charges are made by parties holding such amusements, or managing such machines \$ 2.00 per day, or \$ 5.00 per week.

Fifth--Merry-go-round \$ 10.00 per week first week, and \$ 5.00 for each additional week.

Sixth--Theatrical performances, musical concerts, shows or exhibitions by traveling performers, and for all other shows or exhibitions and performances (circuses and menageries excepted); license may be issued to the proprietor or manager, or agent, of such exhibition, performance, or show, upon the payment of \$ 2.00 for a license for each and every day of such performance.

Seventh--Every circus or menagerie shall pay the sum of \$ 10.00 per day for such license, and each side show or traveling exhibition with a circus or menagerie for which an extra charge is made for admission thereto, whether under th

same management or not, shall pay the sum of \$ 2.00 per day for each side show or exhibition.

Eighth--For each express wagon, transfer wagon or vehicle used and kept for hire to carry articles or property of any description within the town of Sugar City, \$ 8.00 per annum for each one horse wagon or vehicle, \$ 12.00 per annum for each wagon or vehicle on which more horses than one are used.

Ninth-- For each ~~pool~~ pool table, billiard table, ball alleys for public use, \$ 10.00 per year.

Tenth--Auctioneers \$ 5.00 per annum.

Eleventh--Nothing in this ordinance shall be held to apply to any person coming into town, with teams or otherwise, to dispose of vegetables, meats, fruits, farm produce, or other articles of their own raising or manufacture.

Twelfth: Nothing in this chapter shall be held to require the procuring of a license by livery stable men doing their ordinary legitimate business, nor merchants or retail dealers delivering their goods, wares and merchandise free of charge with their own vehicles.

Thirteenth: All sales made at public auction under and by virtue of any legal process or by any trustee or mortgagee, shall be exempt from the provisions of this ordinance.

Fourteenth: Any person desiring to obtain a license or permit to carry on or conduct any business, avocation or calling mentioned in this ordinance, or for which a license shall hereafter be required, shall pay to the Town Treasurer in cash, in lawful money of the United States, in advance, the amount specified in this ordinance.

The Town Treasurer will issue to said applicant two receipts for said money in duplicate. Upon presentation of one of said receipts by said applicant to the town clerk, the town clerk

may issue to the person therein named the license for the purpose therein specified.

Fifteenth: A violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall subject the person convicted of such violation to a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00.

Sixteenth: Ordinance Number 16, an ordinance being entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Licenses," passed July 20, A.D. 1900, and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
