

ORDINANCE NUMBER 99

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE NAMING OF STREETS AND AVENUES WITHIN THE INCORPORATED TOWN OF SUGAR CITY, COLORADO, CHANGING THE NAMES OF THOSE ALREADY ESTABLISHED AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NUMBER SIXTY-EIGHT PASSED AND APPROVED APRIL 17th, 1911.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE INCORPORATED TOWN OF SUGAR CITY, COLORADO.

SECTION 1. That from and after the passage of this ordinance all public highways or thoroughfares within the Incorporated Town of Sugar City, running north and south shall be designated as streets, and shall be named after states of the United States of America, and all public highways or thoroughfares running east and west in said Town of Sugar City shall hereafter be called avenues, and shall bear the name of some City or President of the United States. This rule shall apply not only to the public highways now laid out but to those which may hereafter be established.

SECTION 2. The names of the Avenues and Streets now existing shall be changed as follows:-

Cronk Avenue shall be hereafter known as Colorado Street.

Blackwell Street shall be hereafter known as Monroe Avenue.

Sugar House Road shall be hereafter known as Baltimore Avenue.

SECTION 3. Ordinance Number Sixty-eight Passed and Approved April 17th, 1911 is hereby repealed.
