Just a stone's throw away from some of the best academic and employment opportunities in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex.

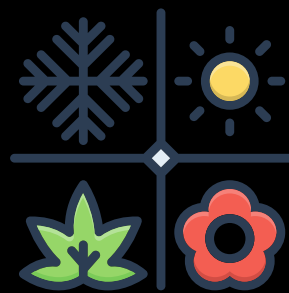
City History
