MESSAGE FROM THE MANAGER

There's lots of activity going on at Museum of the Everglades as we move into our busy season. We've been working diligently to complete the new exhibits that we've added and also those being upgraded or restored. Our revised CALUSA exhibit is nearing completion and new artifacts have been added. Alongside replicas of a ceremonial mask, a carved alligator totem, and barracuda jaw saw (a local archeologist told me this could actually be used to cut down a tree!) we've placed pieces of native pottery and tool fragments made from bone and shell excavated from local sites.

We are also making great progress on our HURRICANES exhibit. Originally mentioning only Hurricane Donna, this area is being expanded to include the stories of Hurricane Wilma and the recent devastation of Hurricane Irma as well as historic photos of storms that the hit the region in 1926, 1928, 1935, 1945, and more. The exhibit will maintain some of the photos from the "Images of Irma" exhibit by artist JohnBob Carlos while adding others donated by local photographer Captain Bruce Hitchcock.

The Museum recently hosted a visit from 20 museum professionals in town for the annual Florida Association of Museums (FAM) conference held in Naples this year. These guests were treated to a narrated history of the Tamiami Trail during their bus ride and then enjoyed an amazing buffet of "Cracker Cuisine" with frog legs, fish dip and gator bites (*see photos on left*). Everyone thoroughly enjoyed their excursion and Museum of the Everglades was the talk of the conference all week.

We will be hosting a similar evening filled with food, fun and stories in January as more of our friends and supporters return to the area – celebrating the next exhibit in the Pauline Reeves Gallery, "The Rod & Gun Club: from Pioneer Homestead to Dignitary Destination". This exhibit will display images and artifacts telling the story of the historic hunting and fishing lodge that began life as the Storter family home. A fixture in the culture and commerce of Everglades City since its days as a general store, this local institution has hosted all manner of celebrities and several U.S. Presidents. The exhibit opens on November 5th and our "Remembering the Rod & Gun" evening event takes place on Friday, January 4th – one month before it closes.

Meanwhile, you can join us for a meet and greet with photographer Matt Stock on Saturday, October 27th (1pm – 3pm) where he will share his adventures about finding and photographing ABANDONED VEHICLES OF THE EVERGLADES (currently on display in the Pauline Reeves Gallery until November 3rd.)

Mid-Month Movie Night continues on Friday, October 19th with "Bad Spirits" – a family-friendly ghost story (no blood, no monsters) about relic hunters who disturb a burial ground. Filmed in Everglades National Park and on the Miccosukee Reservation, we present this independently-produced film from 2007 as another chapter in our continuing exploration of the many movies made in our region. Get in the Halloween spirit and join us for a spooky story so tame it won't give anybody nightmares!
