1953 – incorporation of the City of Everglades


1978 – founding of Collier County Museum

MESSAGE FROM THE MANAGER by Thomas Lockyear

February has been a busy and productive month here at Museum of the Everglades as visitors from around the country and around the world make their way to our city.

The natural wonders of the Everglades and the rich, unique history of the region make each visit extraordinary. Many visitors enjoy the wide variety of culture and cuisine at the annual Everglades City Seafood Festival early in the month followed our own Marjory Stoneman Douglas Festival during the final week. This was our 14th consecutive year offering this event and it was, as usual, very well-attended. Guests were treated to seminars and activities ranging from explorations of environmental science to the history of Florida's Cracker Cattle.

February also saw field trips from Everglades City School – the last Kindergarten through 12th Grade facility in the state of Florida – with every grade getting the opportunity to visit both our museum and the Marco Island Historical Museum. Students explored, among other things, our exhibit on Plume Hunting in the Pauline Reeves Gallery. Later in the week, we brought an Arts Integration program promoting STEAM curriculum to the school as part of our Educational Outreach initiative. Along with Curator of Education Joy Murphy, we had the opportunity to convey a better understanding of how the industry of fancy feathers for ladies' hats drove many of our wading bird species to the brink of extinction. Students of all ages created their own plumed hats and designed new species of birds by combining different styles of wings, beaks and feet – exploring the abilities and advantages offered by each natural characteristic.

Our opportunities to partner with Everglades City School were recently expanded by the generous donation of ten iPads to the school by the Friends of Museum of the Everglades. This gift will facilitate the launch of an oral history program at the school wherein students can use these devices to record family history and help the museum to preserve local history and share more of the region's untold stories.

On April 2nd a new exhibit entitled "Seven model T's, One Elcar, and a Truck – Trailblazing the Tamiami Trail" will go up in the Pauline Reeves Gallery, telling the unlikely tale of the men who, as part of a publicity stunt, drove across the Everglades before there was a road, inspiring Barron Collier to finance the construction of a highway through South Florida's watery wilderness.

This exhibit will be expanded on April 16th with an addition titled "The Tamiami Trail – Building the Road that Connected Florida's Coasts" which will feature the return of MOE's scale model of the Bay City Walking Dredge, the mechanical wonder that made the project possible, now freshly conserved and refurbished.

MOE will celebrate the 90th Anniversary of the completion of the Trail on Saturday, April 28th with a parade, live music, and more. We hope you will join us for this historic event.
