MESSAGE FROM THE MANAGER by Thomas Lockyear

March came in like a lion and then stayed that way here at Museum of the Everglades. The number of daily visitors just never seemed to slow down! We have nonetheless kept working on additions and improvements to the museum.

We added a couple artifacts to the main gallery including a vintage wooden **airboat propeller** generously donated by local tour operator Bruce Minton. This beautiful piece will be the center of an exhibit detailing the history of airboats in the area and how they have evolved from an essential mode of transportation into a favorite way to see the glades for visiting tourists.

We also reclaimed an amazing diorama of Everglades City circa 1928 made for the museum when it first opened by late local artist **Camille Baumgartner**. I had seen this unique construction in photos from the museum's early days and made some inquiries about what had happened to it. Former FME president Patty Huff was able to find it tucked away in a closet at City Hall and brought it back to its original home here at MOE. Camille was a very colorful character and we hope to include a little of her story as a part of the new permanent display of her creation. We showed "Thunder and Lightning" starring David Carradine (of Kung Fu fame) as a moonshiner in the glades for our mid-month movie in February and everyone had a rip-roaring time with all the car chases through the local countryside. This month we'll be moving indoors.


On **Saturday**, April 13, we are proud to host the first public showing of "Voices of the Glades", a recent documentary about Hurricane Irma and its aftermath. The documentary will be screened at 5pm with refreshments provided by the Friends of Museum of the Everglades. 

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
