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EDISON & FORD IN SOUTHWEST FLORIDA

Thomas Edison travelled to Southwest Florida in 1885, the year that the first tarpon was caught with a rod & reel off Punta Rassa at the mouth of the Caloosahatchee River. He fell in love with the area and bought land near Fort Myers where he built a compound consisting of houses, laboratory, and a swimming pool in the large garden.

Twenty years later, Henry & Clara Ford with son Edsel visited their friend Edison and bought a winter home called "The Mangoes" next door.

The two families enjoyed exploring in the hinterland of Florida's Last Frontier, observing nature on their camping forays. In fact, Ford offered to buy the Fakahatchee and donate the land to the State but back in 1922 there was no Park Service so he was refused.

The new exhibit in the Pauline Reeves Gallery at the front of our Museum displays old photos of them at home or relaxing in the wilderness, thanks to the Edison & Ford Winter Estates non-profit which manages the property.
