# EDISON & FORD IN SOUTHWEST FLORIDA

There was a full house for the Third Thursday Talk on August 15 when Matt Andres, curatorial registrar of the Edison & Ford Winter Estates, spoke about the two great men and their experiences in our area.

We learned that Edison first came to Florida in 1885, took the train from St. Augustine to Cedar Key, and then went by boat to Punta Rassa and decided to explore the local area. He bought 13 acres from Jacob Summerlin, the cattle baron, and built a retreat where he could relax from business worries. That was just the beginning – he persuaded his friend Henry Ford to join him and the fan
