



OUR HISTORY

Birthed in 1997 as a grassroots community movement by four Black women to reach women in the Kansas City community who had experienced trauma, in July 2014, Sisters in Christ was formally established as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization and opened its administrative office in Raytown, MO. To this day, our leadership team has unmatched lived experience in serving individuals and families transitioning toward self-sufficiency. In fact, CEO Carolyn Whitney is a 21-year resident of Raytown and has more than two decades of experience providing case management to low-income families. Several other staff members have lived experience receiving public assistance such as SNAP, WIC, TANF as well as rent/utility assistance during their personal transitions toward selfsufficiency.

OUR MISSION & STRATEGY

Every day, Sisters in Christ works to confront a fragmented and inadequate system of community support for mental health, substance abuse, affordable housing, employment, and family cohesion, particularly for the formerly incarcerated and unhoused in the Kansas City community. Sisters in Christ's mission is to assist in the transformation of people by creating and weaving together a cohesive set of resources that promote their physical, emotional, financial, and spiritual wholeness. Sisters in Christ serves as a resource conduit, personal advocate, and supporter for those we serve. Our outcome areas include mental health, affordable housing, employment, education, and life transitions.



OUR PROGRAMS

Sisters in Christ manages three transitional homes in the Kansas City, Missouri urban core: Carolyn's House of Faith, Serenity House, and Habakkuk House for women experiencing houselessness and reentering the community after incarceration. Annually, Sisters in Christ serves between 50 to 60 women through its Transitional Supportive Housing Program. The homes are accredited by the National Alliance for Recovery Residences (NARR) and certified by the Missouri Department of Mental Health.









Sisters in Christ's Dahomey Training Center is a hands-on entrepreneurship education and job training program designed for women with histories of substance abuse, experiencing housing and employment struggles, and transitioning from incarceration. Classes are offered to equip women in mastering life and job skills needed to sustain living wage employment and thrive specifically in the skilled trade industry.

TRANSITIONAL SUPPORTIVE HOUSING & DAHOMEY TRAINING CENTER:

• **47 clients** served through transitional supportive housing and wraparound services (**5,217 visits**)

 61 clients served through transitional supportive housing, Dahomey Training Center, and other wraparound services (20,157 visits including 20,113 class units and 44 intake assessments)

• 4 women served through GED/HiSET Tutoring (184 visits)





Through a partnership with Jackson County COMBAT, Sisters in Christ coordinates the **Raytown Safe Zone Neighborhood Hub**, "a one-stop shop" where individuals and families at-risk for violent lifestyles can receive case management and care coordination. Sisters in Christ regularly receives referrals for Safe Zone from the Raytown Police Department and Raytown C-2 School District.



Youth Life Link is a subprogram of Safe Zone that provides at-risk youth with team-building activities which build camaraderie and enhance their academic achievement, community involvement, financial outlook, and resiliency against crime and violence.

The Mental Health Services Program provides trauma-focused, evidencebased, and culturally sensitive therapeutic interventions and case management to women, youth, and children. Sisters in Christ partners with Black-led and minority-serving clinical therapists. Therapeutic interventions offered include Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT), Eye Movement Desensitization Reprocessing (EMDR), Trauma Center Trauma Sensitive Yoga (TCTSY), and Child-Parent Psychotherapy (CPP).

SAFE ZONE NEIGHBORHOOD HUB:

•1246 families including 5275 individuals through Safe Zone Monthly Food Distribution (documented 1246 visits over 8 months)

 Approximately 179 individuals through Safe Zone Food Pantry (documented 895 visits over 5 months)

• 45 youth through Safe Zone Youth Life Link Tutoring (308 visits)

 105 community members through Safe Zone Youth Life Link Yard Service (105 visits over 2 months)



HONOREES



Judge Ardie Bland- Restorative Justice Award

Ardie A. Bland served as a Municipal Court Judge for the 16th Judicial Circuit Court of Missouri – Kansas City Municipal Division for fourteen years. He was appointed by Kansas City, Missouri Mayor Mark Funkhouser and the City Council in 2008. Prior to his appointment, Judge Bland operated his own law office. In addition to handling traditional Municipal Court cases, Judge Bland presided over the Veterans Treatment Court for thirteen years; and in 2015 became the judge for the Mental Health Court where he served for seven years. He also presided over the Municipal Court Truancy Court from 2012 to 2015. Under Judge Bland's direction, more than 400 students from the various school districts serving Kansas City, Missouri successfully improved attendance rates between 5 to 25 percent. In September 2022, he was appointed by President Biden to serve as a Veterans Law Judge for the Board of Veterans' Appeals. Judge Bland is a lifelong resident of Kansas City. He holds a Bachelor of Science in economics from Truman State University and received a Juris Doctor Drake University Law School.



Dr. Robert Cordell- NextGen Catalyst Award

Dr. Robert Cordell serves as the Director of Student Support Services in the Raytown School District. Previously, he was a social studies classroom teacher, Assistant Principal and Principal. Robert earned a Bachelor of Arts in History and Secondary Education from Missouri State University, a Master of Education Degree in Secondary School Administration, an Education Specialists Degree in Secondary School Administration and a Doctor of Education in School Administration and Educational Policy Study from the University of Missouri-Kansas City. Dr. Cordell has been serving in education for 23 years. Robert's wife is Dr. Casey Cordell. They have been married for 23 years and they have three daughters: Cailyn (20), Claire (16) and Campbell (12).






Theresa Galvin - Authentic Leader Award

Theresa Cass Galvin has served on the Jackson County Legislature for eight years. For two of those years she held the leadership role of Chairman and two more years as Vice Chairman. Theresa began her career, which spanned 30 years in the construction industry, in the front office and worked her way up to owning her own construction company. Theresa is the daughter of a United States Air Force family. Her family moved back to Kansas City when Theresa was in grade school. She attended schools in the Hickman Mills School District and graduated from Hickman Mills Senior High School. Theresa and her husband, Billy, have 4 children and 5 grandchildren. Theresa is a member of the American Legion Post 21, American Legion Auxiliary and a life member of the Ladies Auxiliary with VFW Post 5789. Lisa McIntire- Unsung Hero Award

Lisa is a native of the Kansas City area and has a passion for strengthening and supporting our Community. She has built a 26-year career in banking and as the Vice-President of Commercial Banking for First Citizens Bank, plays an active role in helping business owners, entrepreneurs and executives become successful and execute their dreams and visions for the organizations they lead. Lisa is also an advocate for supporting philanthropic needs throughout the Kansas City Community and invests her time and resources volunteering for various not-for-profit organizations and currently serves as the President of Dream Factory's Kansas City Chapter, a 100% volunteer-based organization. During her 5 years volunteering for Dream Factory, she has played an integral part leading the efforts to bring hope and smiles to more than 275 children battling chronic and critical illnesses. Lisa also serves on Dream Factory's Executive Board and the Boards of Blue Valley Industrial Association, Midwest Small Business Finance and Clay County Economic Development Council.





Vince Ortega- Transformation Initiative Award

Since 2018 Vince Ortega has served as the Executive Director of Jackson County COMBAT. He had previously serviced as the COMBAT Deputy Director since 2009. Vince brought to COMBAT a distinguished 30-year career with the Kansas City Police Department, rising through the ranks to become Deputy Chief. During his KCPD career, his assignments included serving as Executive Officer to the Chief of Police, Commander of the Patrol Bureau, Homeland Security, Intelligence Unit, Internal Affairs, Violent Crimes Division, Human Resources, and the Drug Enforcement Unit. He was also recipient of more than 70 awards and commendations. Upon retiring as a Deputy Chief, he served as the National Security Specialist for General Electric's Homeland Protection Division, where he was a Domain Expert. He holds a Master of Public Affairs degree from Park University, where he previously earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice. Vince is a life-long resident of Kansas City. He and his wife, Gillian, have been married 40 years.

Adrienne Powell- Perseverance Award



Adrienne Powell was born in Atlanta, GA and raised in Kansas City, MO. She graduated from Lincoln Prep and went on to obtain a Bachelor's degree in Social Work and then a Master's of Social Work from the University of Central Missouri and St. Louis University, respectively. She began her professional career in St. Louis, MO and worked in a number of different capacities such as clinical supervisor, director of Imani House, adjunct professor at UMKC, therapist and most recently, licensure supervisor for professional social workers in the state of Missouri. She was also included in Who's Who in Black Kansas City twice for her community leadership. She has a passion for implementing evidence-based therapy programs and developed two new programs while working for a local community mental health organization which are still in place today. Ms. Powell has always had a passion for working with those in need of assistance and support as well as developing skills in clinicians to effectively provide that support and has done so for three decades. She has 3 sons; Stanley, Brandon and Christian and one granddaughter, Raya. Ms. Powell is a member of Delta Sigma Theta, Incorporated, KCMQ Alumnae Chapter.





C.T. Taylor- Legacy and Provision Award

Colonel Taylor hails from Kansas City, Kansas, and is a 1974 graduate of J.C. Harmon High School and went on to play 4 years of football at Washburn University. He received his B.A. Business from Washburn and was commissioned into the Air Force in 1978. He received his M.A. in Public Administration from Golden Gate University in San Francisco, California, and his M. A. National Resource Management from the Industrial College of the Armed Forces, National Defense University, Washington DC. After 29 years of military service, he is the recipient of the Defense Superior Service Medal and numerous other military decorations. On Apr 3, 2008, Colonel Taylor opened the Chick-fil-A at Oak Park Plaza as the Owner/Operator. Judge Martina Peterson


