The Assumption of Mary

The next few weeks we encounter several challenging truths to our faith and Catholic beliefs. This week with the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and next week the powerful teaching on the Eucharist. The Roman Catholic understanding and Love of Mary and the Eucharist have caused the greatest dialogue and controversy in the history and growth of Christianity. It is so important for us as disciples to grapple with the truths of our faith, especially in a world and culture that is searching and questioning - we need to be prepared to correctly respond and inform. There are different seasons in our life, where we can in some way almost blindly follow what our parents, or family have always believed, and there's a beauty and innocence to that. But as we grow in age and understanding it is important that the faith of our childhood, and the child-like faith we have been blessed with, expands, and grows. In that personal growth we experience wisdom and humility.

The Blessed Mother is such a model of humility. This young girl, this favored and beloved daughter of God; was chosen to be the Mother of God. Let that sink in for a moment. It is Mary's DNA, her eye color, hair color, skin color, these are all the attributes given to the baby born in Bethlehem, for the Christ child - Jesus. She was given a challenging mission to bear, and yet she was able to navigate that journey with such grace and poise. It's interesting, this past week with so much going on in our world (and the Church), I had a sense that there was almost a conflict between humility and arrogance.

Last Tuesday we celebrated the Feast Day of Saint Lawrence, a deacon who served the poorest of the poor of Rome around the year 255 and was a personal assistant to the Pope. There was an extremely arrogant and insecure Roman Emperor known as Valerian, and he brought about a persecution of the faithful. He apprehended and publicly mocked Pope Sixtus and some of his companions, Valerian was so tormented that some of his "subjects" would NOT recognize him as the sole king and leader - he unraveled. After martyring the Pope and to assert his earthly power and might over the empire, he called out the deacon, Saint Lawrence to present to him all the treasures and riches of the Catholic Church. Although many would think that the Saint would gather the artwork and sacred chalices and vessels of the Church to give to the emperor - he brought forth the poor, the widows, the orphans into the public square. When Valerian asked him, "What is this?", Saint Lawrence simply said, "as you asked emperor, I present to you the treasures of the Church!"

Looking back over this week I too see the arrogance in the leadership of our world – whether in Washington, Albany, and the local level as well. When I see the dismissal of our humanity placed into categories of accuser or witness #1, or a line/sentence in an infrastructure bill, or the latest positive COVID case/deaths – it is dehumanizing. We look to the "experts" and "specialists" who seem to be more concerned with the SPIN or message that will create a positive or favorable response from constituents, or influencers. Where is the humility to simply say, "I am sorry, or I was wrong, or I desire to do better?" This past week I spent a lot more time praying with, listening to, and reading about Mary, Lawrence, Clare, Maximilian Kolbe, and Jesus – then I did with governors, senators, emperors, and presidents. It was a stark reminder of who I really put my hope and trust in. Yes, I am grateful to be an American, for the laws and protections we are blessed to have, for the gift of science and medicine – but I was reminded with the writing on the coin I held in my hand – it is "In God we trust." And I hold onto that truth.

With great humility, (I hope the humility of Mary and the Saints) – I want to encourage and remind you to return home to in-person worship at St. William the Abbot. Be wise and comfortable – you will see as you return to SWA that there are still sections of the church that are roped off and allow for social distancing. There are still parishioners and clergy who choose to wear masks during the liturgy, and there are still those who are not well, or whose health is compromised, or even the anxiety of this significant bump in COVID/Delta cases who will choose to wait a little longer before returning. This is morally acceptable. I desire for your continued presence and support of the parish so we can sustain the ministries and services to the community – but these are extraordinary times and call for extraordinary wisdom and cooperation. I do not have all the answers of what is to come for us as a world, country, or parish – we will continue to celebrate Mass online everyday – and provide dedicated staff and volunteers to reach out to those who are not able to (at this time) join us in person. Do not hesitate to contact us with a specific need for you personally or a loved one – who may just not be ready to return. We will be here for you, and we are willing to come to you – to bring the Sacraments, the Eucharist, or other possible care and service. But if we do not know, we cannot respond. Please, contact us.

Lastly, I invite you to come home as a family to Mass, prayer, lighting a candle, confession, the stations of the cross, the rosary. To Rediscover the Sacred that has been a central part of Seaford for almost 95 years. Today we honor Our Lady and her Assumption, and next week her Crowning in Heaven. To celebrate the Queenship of Mary – we have added an additional Sunday Mas, at 5:00 PM which will be followed by an outdoor procession through the property and local neighborhood. Come and pray with us, let us build and strengthen the true Kingdom, as a family united in Our Lord and Lady!


Missals

When the Pandemic began, Bishop Barres allowed for a dispensation for the faithful from physically attending Mass. So many of you "attended" Mass virtually through Facebook Live Masses until we were able to establish the YouTube channel providing Mass each day. We also made available Communion on Sundays following the 12 noon live-streamed Mass outside in the parking lot near the Abbey entrance. Please know that as of August 15th, 2021, that dispensation from physically attending Sunday Mass will no longer be granted, and we will no longer provide Communion after the 12 noon Sunday Mass. Obviously, if you are not well and are unable to attend, for your safety and health, and for the rest of the community, please stay home and watch. We can also identify a priest, deacon, or an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion to bring Communion to your home.

Fellowship Tent of Meeting

In Exodus 33:7-11, the intimate prayer of Moses with God is described. A designated place for prayer, a "tent of meeting," was set up outside of the Israelite camp. As Moses would enter this tent, a "column of cloud" would descend upon it, signaling the presence of the Lord, to whom Moses would then speak "face to face, as one man speaks to another." With their intercessor standing before God, the Israelites would then begin to pray "at the entrance of their own tents."

We will begin to extend the opportunity to come together after selected Masses each weekend just as the Israelites did with a Fellowship Meeting Tent. The Fellowship Meeting Tent will take place at two selected Masses each weekend. The selected Masses will be announced in future bulletins and our social media. Each week the tent will feature refreshments.

Last Month to File for HEAP!

This year, the deadline for heating assistance applications was extended through August 31, 2021. HEAP helps eligible households meet the cost of heating their homes. The benefit can pay for fuel, your utility source, heating equipment replacement and repairs. The benefit is paid either directly to the heating vendor or utility company. Background Screening Update The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People:

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (The Charter) promulgated by the Bishops of the United States in 2002 outlines specific practices and guidelines providing standards of safety in parishes and dioceses throughout the United States. As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete three requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children Program (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct;
- 3. Complete a background screen application. The Diocese requires all those who remain in active ministry be rescreened at 5 yr. intervals. volunteers/employees.

A Word on Background Screening of Volunteers:

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (OFPCYP) has streamlined the volunteer application process enabling volunteers to complete the three safe environment requirements in one step. Individuals wishing to volunteer in a parish or school:

- Register to attend a Protecting God's Children class and create a Virtus account on the Virtus website: <u>www.Virtus.org</u>
- 2. Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct- provided during the Virtus registration process.
- 3. Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application background offered during the Virtus registration process.

Active Volunteers:

If you are active in a parish ministry, have already attended Virtus and have been background screened you may be at – or beyond- the *5yr. rescreening requirement*. If this is the case, you will receive an email from *Sterling Volunteers* asking you to complete the background screening application on-line. You may access the background screening application by following the prompt in the email or logging into your Virtus account. *Please be aware-this is not a scam nor has your e-mail been hacked.* The OFPCYP has been working with your parish to update the Safe Environment records and noted it is time for you to be rescreened. You may also be prompted to electronically resign the Code of Conduct when you log into your Virtus account.

Once in your account, review your account information-particularly your e-mail address. If your account requires updating, please hit the TOOLBOX tab at the top of the screen. On the left side of your screen in the green column click "Update My Account" You will be able to make the necessary changes-please remember to hit the SAVE button at the bottom of the screen.
