'Rich in what matters to God' Luke 12:21

This Sunday, we hear a challenging and powerful reminder from Jesus in the Gospel of Luke: "Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God" Luke 12:21. It's a verse that invites us to pause and reflect deeply. What are the treasures we are building up? What do we truly value - and how does God see our wealth? In the eyes of the world, success might be measured in possessions, promotions, or popularity. But in the eyes of God, it is the depth of our faith, the sincerity of our love, and the ways we serve one another that make us truly rich.

When we look at our calendars and schedules, it is clear that the world pulls us in so many directions. Work can become all-consuming, and the desire to provide for our families, while noble, can easily veer into the territory of "keeping up with the Joneses." We quickly upgrade our phones, our kitchens, our backyards - sometimes out of necessity, but often out of a cultural pressure to do more, be more, and have more. Did you see the stoneworker they used? Their firepit and patio set has an outdoor TV, whoa! Did you see they just returned from that showcase, or tournament, or dance competition in Nashville! These things are not inherently bad - many are good and even joyful - but we must ask: are they essential? Are they right ordered? Are we giving God the best of ourselves, or does He just get the leftovers?

In the quiet and simplicity of August, I'm taking a step back to reflect on these big questions myself. As some of you know, I'll be walking a portion of the Camino de Santiago, a centuries-old pilgrimage that stretches across northern Spain. I will begin in the historic city of León and walk toward the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela, the resting place of the Apostle James. Almost 200 miles! This isn't just a physical journey – it serves as a spiritual retreat, a time for discernment, prayer, and listening to the Lord's voice more clearly. I'll be asking the Holy Spirit for wisdom - not just for my own vocation as a priest, but for the future of our parish family here in Seaford – in what direction is the Lord calling us, moving us as we approach the century mark as a parish.

St. William the Abbot, our beloved patron, made this pilgrimage over 900 years ago. As I walk in his footsteps, I will be praying for his intercession - for clarity, courage, and grace. And know this: I'll be carrying you with me each day. I'll carry your names, your intentions, your struggles, and joys. In a very real way, each mile walked will be a prayer for our parish family – a vibrant, alive, and faithful community on the south shore of Long Island. For you as well, I pray that these August days serve as an opportunity to weigh what will be the focus and center of your lives – as a family this upcoming school year, into the fall, and the changes that will occur in September. Many of you have shared with me the frustrations of overactivity of your kids, and, again, many and most of these opportunities are good things. But are they essential? Are they the best for your family? Step off the treadmill of activity; pause and pray and ask God what He thinks is best.

If we were to take out the map and roadway of our life, ultimately Heaven is our goal. Eternal life with God is the destination that matters above all else. May we continually re-orient our lives, our families, and our priorities toward that promise. Let's not just be successful by the standards of this world, but rich in what matters most to God. I am told that the popular saying along the way is "Buen Camino" - may we all walk the Good Way together in Seaford, Massapequa, Wantagh, and beyond; on the LIRR or the LIE; on the sidelines, and in the hallways – we journey as a family of faith, always with God as our guide.

ABOUT OUR PROGRAM

- Our program is on developing a life-long relationship between your family and Jesus through Christ-centered lessons and in the communal celebration of the Eucharist each week
- Sacramental preparation are two-year programs: children must complete Levels 1 and 2 before receiving First Holy Communion and Levels 7 and 8 before receiving Confirmation
- Program discount is available for parent volunteers

NEW/TRANSFER FAMILIES

Students who previously attended another program must have a transfer letter sent to the Office of Faith Formation by their former parish

MASS ATTENDANCE

All children are required to attend 75% of Sunday/Holy Days of Obligation Masses between September and May and check-in using the QR codes in the church in order to complete their grade level and receive sacraments

SCHEDULE

- Level 1: Parent-Lead at Home
- Level 2: Parent-Lead at Home (September-December) & Weekly In-Person Classes (January-April)
- Levels 3-6: Meet Weekly In-Person at SWS
- Levels 7-8: Meet Bi-Weekly In-Person in The Abbey

A person wishing tovolunteerinany parish ororganizationintheDioceseof Rockville Centre must first complete three requirements:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
- 3. Complete a background screening application.

(Background screening is conducted on all volunteers and employees every 5 years.)

Directions to Complete the 3 Requirements:

- 1. Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children class: www.Virtus.org When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.
 - a. If you have not attended a Virtus class, you are a first time registrant.
 - b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization-from the drop down list select Rockville Centre-Safe Environment.
 - c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
 - d. One screen will have the **Codes of Conduct**. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
 - e. Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
 - f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.
 - 2. Background Screening Application:
 - a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing the background screening.
 - b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION! If you stop-you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
 - c. You will need to provide your Social Security #; if you do not provide a Social Security # you will be charged a fee.
 - d. After completing the application, hit the 'Submit Button'

Summer Food Donations




Prayer Shawl Ministry Meeting August 5


