### - A Message from Fr. James -

My friends,

"He is risen! Truly, He has risen! Alleluia!"

After praying and speaking with spiritual confidants, brother priests who have known and cared for me over the years, I have decided to take some time off from public ministry. Bishop Barres, Father Joe, my family, and friends have supported my decision. Although I am sad that I will not be with you for some time, I am at peace and know that the Lord is inviting me to take some time to reflect on my life as a Christian and as a priest.

The joys and the struggles of priestly life these past seven years have been an incredible learning experience for me. I never thought priestly life would be so tough and yet so beautiful. What makes it beautiful is you – the person reading these few lines right now – I thank you for your witness and for your faith.

Jesus tells us that if we do not pick up our cross daily and follow Him, we are not worthy of Him. I do not believe I am running away from my cross, but rather asking for the opportunity and time to better understand my vocation as a son of God and a follower and priest of Jesus Christ.

All of you will be in my daily prayers; please remember me too.

God willing, I will be back at the altar of St. William to offer His praises with you.

"Mercy is heartfelt sympathy for another's distress, impelling us to support them if we can. For mercy takes its name - misericordia - from denoting a person's compassionate heart for another's unhappiness."

The human experience brings us to several situations that can test our hearts, but none is more challenging than when we encounter brokenness and sin in the world. Jesus came to heal that and loved in such a way that was rejected by the culture and world but embraced by a loving Father in heaven. Jesus' journey to the cross forces us to make a decision – we are either all in or all out.

In the confusion that took place following the crucifixion, the apostles fearfully hid in the upper room – their faith tested. They were scared, shamed, confused, but none of that could keep their loving savior away from them. When Jesus entered the room of those who left him at his most difficult moment, he did not react with what could be a common human experience which would be to express anger to those who deny and betray us. No, Jesus shows Divine Mercy, and the first thing he says to them is "peace be with you". His greeting disarms them – relaxes them and reminds them how much they are loved. That lasting peace is something we all desire for our hearts, our families, and our world. That peace helps us to be like those first Apostles and bring the message of peace and hope to the world.

In that spirit of Divine Mercy, I would ask that we all pray in a special way for Father James, who we love so much and has loved us. He is a favored and beloved son of God and may this time allow him to reconnect and recharge.

## **HEAP - Extended Through April 29th**

The application deadlines for regular and emergency HEAP have been extended through April 29th, 2022. HEAP is the Home Energy Assistance Program, which helps low-income individuals and families pay for the cost of heating their homes. Eligibility and benefits are based on multiple criteria such as income, household size and heating source. If you are eligible, you may receive one regular HEAP benefit per program year. You could also be eligible for emergency HEAP benefits if you are in danger of running out of fuel or having your utility service shut off. # **Easter Vigil**






