Gaudete – Rejoice in the promise of the Father

Even in this time of wrapping presents and decorating the house, at the core of all that we do, underneath it all, the Season of Advent is a time to rejoice. Emmanuel - God is with us - and that is a reason for rejoicing! Yes, Jesus was born 2000 years ago but also comes alive today in this Jubilee year of Hope 2025; love is born again and comes alive in us. Gaudete means to rejoice, and the rose/pink candle on the Advent wreath is lighter than the others, it is showing the glimpses, the streaks of Christ's Light, preparing to enter the world.

Last weekend in Connecticut I got a glimpse of that light as our seminarian and dear friend Herley Mendez was ordained a Transitional Deacon. Deacon Herley will serve a parish in Connecticut in the Diocese of Bridgeport and there he will perform baptisms, weddings, and preach the Gospel. His journey has not been easy, he did not get to this place alone and first and foremost we give thanks to God for his parents, his siblings, and the many people who poured into him over the years. When I think of my own experience of leaving my home in North Babylon to study in the seminary in Huntington, it was certainly challenging and new, but driving up 231/Deer Park Avenue was not the same sacrifice Herley made. He left Columbia, the comfort of family, home, and even his native language to be a missionary, to proclaim the Gospel in this foreign land. He is a true light in the world.

As I reflect on this third week of Advent and prayerfully look upon our humble creche scene in the church, I often think of how Jesus entered this world into the "mess." That stable was cluttered, smelly, and not the ideal place for a baby to be born. That sounds like the reality of my life, my family, and the ministry I have been blessed to be entrusted with here at St. William – it can be messy at times. Maybe you too can identify with that as well, and we can feel unworthy for Christ to come to us. We feel the need to tidy everything up and make it perfect before we can welcome Jesus – we want to get our "house is in order" – then we can let God in.

But the scriptures reveal to us that God is writing a different type of story with surprises and plot twists and turns. In the "desert and parched lands there will be abundant and blooming flowers, sorrow will be met with gladness and everlasting joy." The character of John the Baptist is not your typical "God-Guy" of that period, not a Pharisee, scribe, or a Sadducee. He was a bit of an odd duck, wearing camel fur and eating wild honey and locusts. But his goal was personal holiness, and a desire to lead others to God. He is the voice and messenger sent ahead to lay the foundation, clear the path, and prepare the way for the Lord. When John's disciples press Jesus to confirm if he is the Messiah, the One they have all been waiting for, He says look at the fruits of my ministry and work.

If we were to take a personal inventory of our own lives, or even our own disposition of our heart, what would be the results? December has the potential of being a time of running around, searching for Christmas sales, worrying about real issues like finances, bills, and the future of our children. There are some of us who have experienced loss and still have a bit of sadness in our heart. Still others are preparing to be hosts at Christmas and New Year celebrations and that causes anxiety. When Jesus is in our life, we can ask that same question what do you hear and what do you see if God is at the center of our lives? Through overwhelming calm and peace, strong insight and decisions we become right-ordered and then all falls into place. How would you grade yourself right now?

Well, the good thing is Advent is not over and we have time to renew, restore, and refocus ourselves on the Light. John the Baptist is not the only one who is called to testify to the Light. Jesus is coming so let us make straight the paths into our souls, our families, and our parish by preparing for the arrival of the Savior. Certainly, with the decorations, shopping, baking, and songs, but also with quiet time, prayer, Mass, and confession. These next two weeks allow us to make the scriptures come alive, and Jesus more present when we become the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, we become the light and the hope in a world that is hurting. Gaudete – Rejoice!

Home Heating Assistance Now Available

Applications for obtaining HEAP benefits are now being accepted! HEAP is the Home Energy Assistance Program, which helps low-income individuals and families pay for the cost of heating their homes. Eligibility and benefits are based on multiple criteria such as income, household size and heating source. If you are eligible, you may receive one regular HEAP benefit per program year. This benefit is \$900 for oil or propane gas heat, or \$400 for natural gas or electric heat. For more information or to apply, visit https://www.otda.ny.gov/programs/heap/

Long Island PSEG Discounts

Low income households may be eligible for the PSEG Long Island Household Assistance Program. This program provides a monthly electric bill discount of \$45 or more!
