Prepare, Present, Project

Advent 2021 allowed for us as a community of faith to experience the fullness of the season, meaning we got the full four weeks allotted for Advent. And to be honest if you and I did not make time to prepare, it's on us. I personally was able to enter into a few prayerful experiences that really pruned and weeded the garden of my heart to open up a space for Jesus, which included the celebration of Mass each day, daily devotions, quiet time, and last Monday the experience of Sarah Kroger's concert, "Light Has Come." It was an Exodus away from the old, moving into the newness that Advent and Christmas bring. On that Monday evening, Sarah's husband Dom Quaglia offered a reflection that had a strong impact on me, focusing on three words that begin with the letter "P" - prepare, present, and project.

Prepare of course is an obvious Advent word and so many of us have at least attempted to make straight the path for the coming of Jesus into our lives, our family, and the world. We do that in many different ways. In some ways it is the removal of obstacles that will block and distract us from God, in other ways it is adding things such as allowing for more quiet, a little bit more prayer, or a little bit more reading of the Scriptures. If you were to be honest with yourself - how well did you prepare in 2021?

The second word was Presence, and to be more specific to "be present" to others and God. The Holidays can be a distracting time. Let's face it during the Advent and Christmas season there are more "things" on our plates and schedules than usual. We are always trying to "get things in" and while doing so our lives become more like checking a box as opposed to truly being present to one another. What was the experience of decorating your home like this year? Were you able to focus and unite as a family while putting up the Christmas tree? Or the outdoor Christmas lights and display on the front lawn? The making of the Christmas cookies as a family? All these things become part of our traditional routine, but if we do not pay attention, they can become almost burdensome. Instead of listening to the music, and telling the family story, and passing on the great recipes and decorating techniques - that time can be more of a burden then a joy unless we are truly present to one another.

The third "P-word" was Project - as in how are we projecting the Gospel message of light, hope, and love into the world? Jesus ultimately is the source of all these beautiful and much needed qualities in our world today, but you and I have a responsibility to point to Christ and reflect him into the world by the way we live and interact with others. Again, if we were to be honest, have we been able to do that this December? I fell into the trap last week while I was at Stop & Shop of being in a rush and encountered a new checkout person; and to be honest, I cannot say I was the model of projecting God's goodness, patience, and love into the world. Thank goodness I didn't have on my uniform, or I would have gotten a few more phone calls and letters this week! It can be easy at times to see all the things that we should be doing as we prepare ourselves for Christmas, but when people look at you and I as Catholics on the journey towards holiness - what do they actually see?

And so, in 2021 we were gifted with one more week of Advent. If it has been a slow start to this point, I offer you the "three P's" to reset and refocus yourself and your family. As we look at the upcoming week, perhaps time will allow you for the lighting of a candle and quiet prayer at SWA or assisting as an elf with the decorating of the church; for you it may be attending daily Mass and Adoration, or perhaps it is time to experience God's Mercy at Monday night's Parish Penance and Reconciliation Service. The Lord is coming, and we still have the opportunity to wake up and be ready even now – in the Fourth Week of Advent. Or there is an alternative – think about it, to this day we are still talking about the famous Bethlehem Innkeeper for over 2000 years – not because the bed was so comfortable for the Holy Family, the room service provided champagne and chocolates on the nightstand, or the Morning Breakfast was "to die for," or even the window view of Jerusalem was incredible. We talk about the Innkeeper, because he did not have any room for the Messiah – for the baby who would change the world. The Holy Family is knocking on the door of your heart, Jesus wants in, will you make room for HIM?

Have a Blessed and Holy week and thank you for your presence and generosity!






Saint Juan Diego
