## **Happy Easter – We Are Witnesses to an Event!!!**

The Gospel today reveals all of this "running" back and forth, it's exhausting just to listen to it! But why? Why is there so much erratic rushing and movement between the tomb and the upper room? We were told that when Mary Magdalene saw the empty tomb, she ran to tell the others. She was filled with so many emotions, sadness, uncertainty, anxiety, fear, but also just a tinge of hope. Mary was always an attentive and observant disciple. She would have remembered what Jesus promised - that he would return. The Gospel account speaks to that experience, and the importance of telling others about a real historical event shared and described by many authoritative witnesses, then and now. What is our experience with this knowledge and truth?

Easter 2024 has become a very different experience for me than any other time in my 52 years on this earth. Although I experienced loss and death in my own personal journey, and especially here in our St. William the Abbot family over the years, the loss of my dad on December 28th changed everything. My father instilled a faith in Jesus Christ and our Catholic Church upon my family and I from the very beginning. At times people ask me if I have witnessed any "signs" since my father died. His life was a sign and message. He struggled, suffered, and was fearful at times, but throughout his four year illness and two years in hospice, he always faced his journey with great strength, dignity, and hope of what was to come - eternity with God and his loved ones. Watching my dad entrust more and more to the Heavenly Father strengthened my own faith that our Catholic story does not end when we draw our last breath on this earth.

What is interesting is that even in these days of advanced technology and communications, our Christian faith is based on that same Good News. The accounts of the Gospels remind us that the stone had been rolled away and the tomb was empty. The Crucified One had been raised from the dead, and although there were a few mysterious encounters with angels and messengers in the Gospel report, it was when the early apostles and disciples encountered the Risen Lord and then told others. They are the eyewitnesses and story tellers.

Pope Benedict XVI once wrote: "that the Resurrection of Christ is not the fruit of speculation or mystical experience: it is an event which, while it surpasses history, nevertheless happens at a precise moment in history and leaves an indelible mark upon it." 2000 years ago, on the first day of the week, in the early morning real people met the real Jesus – who just a few days before they watched suffer and die. It was not a magic trick, or a hoax, or a conspiracy. People do not suffer torture and violently die in the Roman Coliseum for a hoax. "The light which dazzled the guards keeping watch over Jesus' tomb has traversed time and space. It is a different kind of light, a divine light, that has rent asunder the darkness of death and has brought to the world the splendor of God, the splendor of Truth and Goodness." Jesus wins, death and sin are conquered, and the Heavenly Father has the final word –"and those who live and believe in the Son will never die" for He is the Resurrection and the Life!

On this Easter Sunday, March 31, 2024, we continue to proclaim and witness this powerful truth, an event that changed history - Jesus was raised from the dead. We entrust our loved ones into the hands of the Heavenly Father, and that is how we are able to embrace the Paschal Mystery and the Easter Message of joy, hope, and gratitude. On behalf of Fr. John, Fr. Michael, Deacon Mike, Deacon Tony, Deacon John, and our Seminarians, Deacon Joe Lettieri and Herley Mendez, as well as our dedicated staff, ministry leaders, and volunteers, I wanted to wish you a Blessed and Happy Easter. It is such a privilege and honor "to do" life and faith with you – you have brought me hope, and consolation, and joy. Thank you for your calls, letters of prayer and support, emails of recommendations and suggestions, and well wishes as I have journeyed through sadness and grief at my dad's passing. I am always reminded, we, as a St. William the Abbot family are a people of faith, hope, and love in the victory of Jesus Christ. "We are an Easter people, and Alleluia is our song!"



Easter 2024

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Happy Easter to you and your families! Thank you for your love for the inspired Word of God. Thank you for your love for the Resurrection appearances of our Lord in this Easter season and the way your lives are set on fire in your meditation and contemplation of these mysteries.

Thank you for your fidelity to the Eucharist and the Sunday Mass and your Catholic spirit of evangelization. Thank you for being instruments of Eucharistic Revival.

In *The Joy of the Gospel*, Pope Francis states: "Christ's resurrection is not an event of the past; it contains a vital power which has permeated the world. Where all seems to be dead, signs of the resurrection suddenly spring up. It is an irresistible force... Each day in our world beauty is born anew, it rises transformed through the storms of history... Such is the power of the resurrection, and all who evangelize are instruments of that power." (276)

We continue to live through "the storms of history" and we rely on the Risen Lord and his glorified wounds to touch the wounds in Ukraine, the Middle East, Nicaragua, Venezuela, Armenia and Azerbaijan, the region of the Sahel, the Horn of Africa and Sudan, as well as Cameroon, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, South Sudan and so many other troubled areas of the world. We ask the Risen Lord and his glorified wounds to touch the wounds experienced in our own country.

In *The Everlasting Man*, G.K. Chesterton captured the power of our Lord's Resurrection experienced in the cycles of history. He wrote: "Christendom has had a series of revolutions and in each one of them Christianity has died. Christianity has died many times and risen again; for it had a God who knew the way out of the grave."

This Easter and every Easter we celebrate this Everlasting Man who knew his way out of the grave and who invites us and the Catholic Church on Long Island to a great Resurrection.

We welcome all those visiting us for the first time this Easter and welcome home those of you who have not been with us in a while!




# St. William the Abbot School
