### Jesus Raises the Bar

As we enter the 6th Week of Ordinary Time, and we continue to unpack the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus expresses several very challenging topics. He reinforces the Commandments handed on to us from Moses, He speaks about the importance of forgiveness, He talks about the reality of hell, He unpacks the teaching and doctrine of marriage, and the significance of giving our word and embracing the vows we make before God. Some of Jesus's words and expectations are extremely challenging. We live in a world that is broken and torn by sin, but we also know that Jesus is the remedy of that sin. So often our culture and society desires to move the goalposts or change and lower the expectations to benefit our needs. Jesus always leads us to the ideal, and the Church is the vehicle given to us in order to achieve it. The Lord also recognizes that we do not always live in the ideal, or the perfect - it is good for us to be reminded that He does not ask for perfection but that as His disciples we strive for greater commitment and faithfulness. It is good to know that even when do we fall short, as we all do sometimes, He offers us the truth, the life, and the way to reconciliation, redemption, and restoration.

As we also journey deeper into this year of 2023, we find ourselves drawing closer to the season of Lent. Lent is a time for us as Catholics to refocus and reset our faith and spiritual compass. We enhance our awareness and strive for more - not to shrink back, but to raise the bar in our personal spiritual growth. I am excited at the opportunities that we will have in Lent 2023 to help us do that. I want to encourage you to mark your calendar now for some of these opportunities as you would prepare for your personal or family (kids/grandkids) schedules.

Some of the regular SWA Lenten experiences like:

• Daily Confession and Adoration, Friday night Stations of the Cross, Mercy Monday - April 3rd of Holy week, daily Rosary after Mass, and Saturday morning Miraculous Medal Novena.

Also keep your eyes out for some new faith experiences such as:

• Tuesday Night 7 PM Mass with a guest celebrant, Saturday morning Men's Group, Woman's Lenten Holy Hour, and Divine Mercy Sunday day of prayer with the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal.

The hope over the next few weeks is for all of us to look at Jesus' words and NOT shrink back where we might feel challenged, but to raise the bar. We can all at times get caught up in the rut of complacency and the old saying of "I have always done it this way." For some of you extra Holy folks out there please know that your witness and example of those long-standing faith devotions and practices are so inspiring. But for some of us we might need to mix it up a little bit. We can certainly do that individually by reading the great spiritual writers of the Catholic Church like St. Teresa of Avila, St. Faustina, Mother Theresa, or St. John Paul II. For some it may be listening to Catholic music, or informative podcasts like Bishop Robert Barron's "Word on Fire" or the "Bible in a Year" or "Catechism in a Year" to enhance your knowledge. A few of you have mentioned to me about fasting from food, or drink, or screens (TV, iPad, Netflix) – but let's begin to strategize now.

Friends, let us raise the bar – let us go deeper in our faith and understanding of Christ and the Church, not bury our heads or ignore the opportunity to grow. The Lord is setting us up for great discussions over the next few months as we move towards this solemn time of the liturgical year. Some topics and debates will be stretch us, and we will likely not have all the answers – but are we at least searching for them? Remember the quote from G.K. Chesterton, "The Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting. It has been found difficult; and left untried." I look forward to where the Lord is leading St. William the Abbot.


# Need Help With Your PSEG Bill?


