"Which Voice Do We Listen To?"

I don't really understand the whole concept of Groundhog's Day. I always get confused on whether or not the Groundhog sees their shadow or doesn't see their shadow, or if it means more winter or closer to spring. But I can tell you last week was a blessing because most of that snow disappeared on us. And even though the days only warmed up a tiny bit, there was a sense of hope that springtime is going to come soon. The days are getting just a little bit longer, and on the horizon will be fair weather once again. This weekend we enter into a Gospel that we are very familiar with. It's Luke's version of the Beatitudes, also known as the Sermon on the Plain, meaning a flat surface. Jesus addresses the faithful with the voice of the shepherd, the voice of the lion, the voice of God. Do you recognize that there are many voices and distractions going after our heart? So which voice will we yield to?

For the sports fans out there, we know that this weekend is the Super Bowl and last weekend was the official start to the Winter Olympics and the NHL All Star game. We live in a world that very much lifts up and glorifies professional athletes, and our young people strive to have that kind of success - with the dream of one day winning a championship, or a gold medal. It takes great work to compete at that level, and sacrifice that not everyone is willing to commit to. It takes a personality and a drive, and willingness to do "just about anything" to not only compete, but to win! The world we live in is very focused on the winners, the strongest.

The Gospel today reveals a life path very different than our modern culture's way to live. I often think of what St. Paul said, "I will show you an even better way to live." I remember reading a sermon Pope Saint John Paul II said one time that spoke to this concept. For those who feel a fatigue in our hearts when we are trying to be mindful of those who are vulnerable – the young and the old; for those who feel frustrated by mandates, and masks, and vaccines, and boosters; for those who – even at times when it is hard, try to live for the other – and are aware of other people's rights and needs, and not always so focused on SELF, I give you this short excerpt:

"Blessed are you!" he says, "all you who are poor in spirit, gentle and merciful, you who mourn, who care for what is right, who are pure in heart, who make peace, you who are persecuted! Blessed are you!" But the words of Jesus may seem strange. It is strange that Jesus exalts those whom the world generally regards as weak. He says to them, "Blessed are you who seem to be losers, because you are the true winners: the kingdom of heaven is yours!" Spoken by him who is "gentle and humble in heart" (Mt 11:29), these words present a challenge which demands a deep and abiding metanoia ("conversion") of the spirit, a great change of heart.

You will understand why this change of heart is necessary! Because you are aware of another voice within you and all around you, a contradictory voice. It is a voice which says, "Blessed are the proud and violent, those who prosper at any cost, who are unscrupulous, pitiless, devious, who make war not peace, and persecute those who stand in their way." And this voice seems to make sense in a world where the violent often triumph and the devious seem to succeed. "Yes," says the voice of evil, "they are the ones who win. Happy are they!"

And, are "they" so happy? Those who serve only themselves? My Grandmother once told us a story that the difference between what heaven and hell look like is not much at all. In fact, she explained that heaven and hell had a long table with a lavish meal right in the middle of it. On that table was most sumptuous and delicious food and drink, on both sides of the table people are just sitting there, miserable faces, and not eating at all. We would ask her – "why Grandma"? She told us their elbows did not turn in so they could not feed themselves – the elbow joint bent out a different way, and they were all miserable. But in heaven – it was that same table with sumptuous food, laughter, eating and drinking – because the people sitting at that table also have their elbows facing the wrong way they were conscious and aware of the needs of their neighbors, and they fed one another. We know that there are voices and movements in our heart that can bring us to selflessness and sacrifice, like Jesus – but there is also a tendency to be self-centered and selfish. In our Christian journey the key is to know the difference, to discern the spirit and the voice of Love, and then to choose the right one. Blessed are they who choose correctly!

As you are aware we were hit with that big snowstorm two weeks ago, and the Mass attendance was down significantly, I want to thank so many of you who were so generous in last week's collection in order for us to make up some of the shortfall – I am so grateful for your presence and generosity.












Mrs. Franks's fifth grade science class mixed substances together to observe chemical reactions in action. They were able to see a chemical change right in front of their eyes. The new substance had a color change, smelled different, and had a temperature change. Sure signs of a chemical change!





Class 8-1 begins their week and most religion classes reflecting on the daily readings. We set aside time from the busy week and fast-moving schedule to quiet our minds and hearts. We begin our prayer time by clearing our physical space and listening to calm instrumental music. We use the daily readings feature on the AMEN app by Augustine Institute. The class sits in silent prayer time as they listen to the readings being read to them. After the readings are over, the app leads the students through a guided reflection that urges them to think about what God is saying to them through the day's readings, and how they can use their talents to be a gift to others. The reflection encourages the students to have an open conversation with God. When asked about this prayer time, the 8th graders said they felt more at peace and comforted by the fact they were able to spend time with God during their eventful days. The exposure to scripture motivates the 8th graders to live out their day nourished by God's word.




