#### The Lenten Desert

The Gospel this weekend is short and to the point, Jesus is moved by the Holy Spirit into the desert for 40 days and is tempted by the devil. What????? Each time I read that I cannot help but ask why would the Heavenly Father allow that to happen? The desert is an intense and unforgiving environment. The scorching temperatures, the wild beasts, the lack of protection from the elements – a destination that many people will NOT be going to this winter break. So, what was the reason that Jesus went there? It was a time of preparation. We know that God has been given many names, and titles; one very familiar name is the Good Shepherd. God is a shepherd that knows us and leads us to where we need to be spiritually, physically, mentally, and emotionally.

When I think about the significance of 40 days, we know that 40 days is a time when most of us would be able to solidify an action or routine, or to break a habit that might be detrimental. Think for a moment about the military. The initial experience is Boot Camp (usually 6-10 weeks), which prepares a soldier for battle, but also breaks bad habits. You can think about people who try to detox or break a bad habit, 40 days is a benchmark on the way to recovery. The Catholic Church in her wisdom offers us this time of Lent to do the same, to look at Jesus' example of entering into the desert to assist us, and ultimately to lead us into a greater focus and reliance on him.

Okay, so it is Lent 2024 - what does your Desert experience look like? Is it the adding of spiritual exercises, or the reading of the scriptures, or studying the life of a saint? Perhaps it is attending an additional Mass during the week, or a traditional devotion like Adoration, the Rosary, or the Friday night communal Stations of the Cross. Maybe the Lord is calling you to strip away some of the carnal extras by fasting from certain foods, an addictive habit, or our unbelievable reliance on technology and screens. Let the Holy Spirit guide you to where you may most need to change and grow in this time of your life.

Stay encouraged by the scriptures this week; they reveal that hopeful image of God sending His angels to assist Jesus during that difficult time. Well, who will be the angel He sends to help us this Lent? Be watchful, and attentive during your time in the Lenten Desert – we do not walk alone. I was recently reminded of my pilgrimage to the Holy Land a few years back, and in particular the part where we drove to the Dead Sea. Our tour group was able to witness and experience the Israeli desert, and it was not the most hospitable. I am pretty sure that the airconditioned bus, the fully stocked cooler with water, soft drinks, and snacks were not what Jesus experienced during His time. The Good Shepherd is beckoning us back to Him and the route to holiness is through self-control and sacrifice.

What can we learn from the Spiritual Exercises from the past to assist us in 2024? Jesus and the saints model a full reliance on the Father, a laser focus on God and His providence. If the Spirit is going to lead us to the desert – just like for Jesus, He will surely lead us through it. The challenge if you are like me, is it does not take long before I find myself distracted and wandering. Sometimes, I wander because of circumstances that are tempting me to leave God's presence. Other times it is my brokenness and sinfulness. The danger of wandering is that sometimes we wander too far. We become thirsty and drink from streams that never fulfill or satisfy us.

That is the beauty of Lent – we can reset and refocus on God. I have to laugh that in our modern culture people can be so quick to embrace intermittent fasting. This "new trend" is all over the medical, fitness, and sports journals about the health effects from fasting. And yet people struggle with the church's expectations that lead us not to fit into a wedding dress, a summer bathing suit, or a smaller belt size, but to holiness and the pathway to heaven. To the best of our ability, let us be faithful to the days of fasting and abstinence presented to us by the church instead of focusing on the loopholes and dispensations when things get challenging. It will make for a more fruitful spiritual experience, and ultimately – we will be more whole, and holy! Have a Blessed Lent!

#### Prayer Shawl Ministry




