Call and Response

The scriptures this week reveal an interesting communication between God and humanity, the simple concept of call and response. The Lord invites us into a deeper relationship (His call), and often that involves some sort of mission or vocation for the individual that invokes a response. The prophet Isaiah reveals that in the First Reading, as well as Saint Paul recognizing his "small role" in the advance of the Gospel during the Second Reading. And who can forget the powerful encounter of Jesus stepping into the boat of Simon Peter on the shoreline that day. He could have chosen any of the other fishing boats, but it was Peter's - and that made all the difference for that fisherman's life, and the future of the Church.

As you know last week I was on retreat at the Bethany Center just north of Tampa, Florida, and I have to say although it was not ideal "Florida weather," it certainly beat the 18-24 inches of snow that we received on Long Island. I do want to acknowledge and thank the dedicated staff and maintenance here at St. William the Abbot, as well as our snow removal company that allowed for us to celebrate all the Masses last weekend by clearing the pathways to enter our Church to worship. I would also like to personally thank Fr. James who was able to take care of the spiritual needs of the parish while I was away and deepening my friendship and relationship with the heavenly Father. The retreat was seven full days of silence, I was joined by thirty-five other priests from around the country, and although we did not interact in the usual manner of small talk, meals, and conversations, the intimacy of prayer was powerful and palpable. My hope is that the grace and blessings from the retreat will come out in how I serve you all.

I am also grateful for the great gift of technology and electronic communication, and although I disconnected for the most part during the retreat, I was able to come back to read several emails specifically sent to priests@stwilliam.org. The words of encouragement for me personally, the positive notes about our dedicated ministries, or constructive ways to improve the parish certainly help in our prayer and discernment of how God is calling us to move the parish into the future. Interestingly several of the emails spoke of how Father James and I have recently expressed in our homilies a desire for more people to come back to St. William for church and engage at the celebration of Mass. There always seems to be enough time for other activities, sport practices and games, even the overwhelming amount of people who were sleigh riding last weekend at Cedar Creek. Those are good things and we do not mean to express this solely as frustration, but as a desire for those who have been away to truly meet the Lord. At the same time, some of you shared the many graces and powerful ways that the Lord has strengthened you and your family's faith - both here on the parish campus as well as off in the community.

Thank you. Thank you. It was a great reminder that ultimately it is God who is in control, it is God who enters the boats of our hearts in the exact moment that we and others need Him to. Of course, we must be willing and open for him to climb aboard. It is good for us to remember - as faithful disciples, those called to mission and vocation at this season in our parish and the Catholic Church's history. We are called simply to do our part. And then to trust that the "results" are the Lord's. Your recent emails brought great consolation and peace to my heart and reminded me of prayer often attributed to Saint Oscar Romero – the recent El Salvadorian martyr.

Here is a small portion of it:

It helps, now and then, to step back and take a long view. The Kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is even beyond our vision. We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work. Nothing we do is complete.

No statement says all that could be said. No prayer fully expresses our faith. No program accomplishes the Church's mission. This is what we are about. We plant the seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise. We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something, and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest. We may never see the end results...

There is more to this beautiful prayer, but this snapshot may reflect on this our 95th Anniversary as a parish. For generations people from St. William have received the call from God and responded – as Holy Couples and Families, with a life of service to the Church as religious, priests, and Deacons and devout single lives serving in the vineyard of God. Each and every soul who has walked into the doors of the church throughout our history have been called to plant a seed of faith and hope. In 2022, in the midst of a Global Pandemic, it is now our opportunity to respond to the call. May the Lord Cover and Bless this 95th year for us as a community of motivated disciples and provide for us with many years of service.




Palms




Parish Social Ministry February Homebound Project *'Love One Another'*
