"And the Two Shall Become One Flesh"

The Biblical Theology of Marriage through Basic Anthropology

I'm not sure if it's because this week is my parents 58th Wedding Anniversary, or due to the scriptural references on marriage at Mass this weekend, or because of the many requests sent in to "Stump the Priest" regarding marriage topics, but I thought it would be good to unpack and clarify some basic Catholic teachings on marriage. My hope is to offer the "actual teachings" of the Church – always through the lens of the ideal. Jesus always preaches and teaches to the ideal, even though at times (and if you are like me, most times) we in our humanity do not get that. We are called to look at Human Love in the Divine Plan, and through that we experience ultimate happiness. I have also received requests to explain and comment on other subjects relating to marriage and relationships, such as separation and divorce, cohabitation, same-sex unions, and being married outside the church. Realistically each of these topics could be given in a parish Faith Formation course over many weeks. I will attempt to speak on the basics of the subjects over the next few weeks in my weekly letter and see if there is a desire or interest to do more in the future.

As we begin, I recognize that there are some of us in the community who are striving for personal and family holiness each day and may for the first time be hearing these truths of the Faith. No doubt this topic will affect us personally or someone we love. The desire of the Lord and the Church is to bring us into deeper relationship and union – and we do that through knowledge, understanding and love. There is no magic arrow, line of scripture, or flowing statement on this subject that will answer all the questions, but hopefully we can begin the discussion.

For the Catholic faithful, we humbly submit to almost 2000 years of following Jesus, and looking through the lens of scripture, tradition, and the magisterium (Church teaching and authority). Through some of the brightest minds that have ever walked on this planet, holy men and women have contributed to a Code of Laws for the faithful to follow. When those laws are agreed upon by the community leadership, they become canon, or dogma that assist us in our journey towards holiness and heaven. Many, and most times, Canon Law is aligned with Natural Law and the Civil laws of the world. But we also know that Jesus was countercultural – and often challenged the politics of Rome, of the culture, and society of the time. Today, we as faithful Christians, do the same - we are set apart from this world as we strive to live and love for the next. These guides help us to get to heaven and bring others with us.

The Marriage Canon Laws are listed as Canon 1055 – 1165 – you are more than welcome to read all of them at this link - https://www.vatican.va/archive/cod-iuris-canonici/cic index en.html - on the Vatican website.

My hope in this first week is to go over the basic form and order of Marriage which Jesus raised to the dignity of a sacrament at Cana in the Gospel. A man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of their whole life, and which is ordered by its nature to the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring. Here are the required conditions for a valid marriage to occur when one or both parties are Catholic. For the marriage of a Catholic to be valid, the wedding is celebrated in a Catholic Church (or chapel), there must be present: 1. a bishop, OR a parish priest in his parish OR another priest or deacon duly delegated (by the pastor), and 2. two witnesses. The two spouses must be free to be married (e.g., no prior valid marriages or any other vow that would impede the spouses fulfill their commitment to marriage). They must be psychologically mature and capable of consenting to the marriage; and they must understand the nature of Catholic marriage (i.e., exclusive, permanent, and open to having children). A dispensation (exemption) from the canonical form can be obtained for mixed marriages (a Catholic and non-Catholic).

People at times ask why so many rules/laws/expectations? The Church takes marriage very seriously because God takes it very seriously. That is why there are rules. Marriage is a sacred covenant between a man and woman and God. It is a tremendous gift from God, and it is a visible sign of His love and commitment to His people. Marriage is the foundation of the family and of society, and it is central to the life of the Church. It is also a public act that is celebrated as part of the Church's liturgy and introduces the couple into a special state of life in the Church and society. It creates a permanent and faithful bond between husband and wife, and it establishes significant rights and responsibilities between the married couple and, eventually, their children. It becomes the way for them to love each other into heaven.

The Church through the years has developed tools to assist in supporting the couple to the altar and to heaven – a Pre-Nuptial Investigation (PNI) with the priest, Pre-Cana, FOCCUS, Engaged Encounter Retreats, and encouragement to pray, go to confession, and attend Mass to strengthen them. The Church wants to make sure that a couple is properly prepared for marriage, and that they enter it freely, without reservation, and with full understanding of what is involved. The Church also has an obligation to make sure that the marriage is celebrated in the right way, according to the right forms. All this stems from the obligation to take care of the spiritual health of all of God's people.

But Father Joe, what happens if my marriage, or my family member's marriage, or relationship does not fall so neatly into these "Canons and categories?" Are we/they welcome? Accepted? Banished for a time? Or Life? I want to remind you the challenge of checking all the boxes of a particular subject in an article, a letter, or a homily, it is almost impossible. So, over the next few weeks, I will unpack some of the topics that might pertain to you and your family's experience. Let us pray for those couples who have celebrated Holy Matrimony here in the past and those preparing for marriage at St. William in the future.



Fellowship Tent of Meeting

In Exodus 33:7-11, the intimate prayer of Moses with God is described. A designated place for prayer, a "tent of meeting," was set up outside of the Israelite camp. As Moses would enter this tent, a "column of cloud" would descend upon it, signaling the presence of the Lord, to whom Moses would then speak "face to face, as one man speaks to another." With their intercessor standing before God, the Israelites would then begin to pray "at the entrance of their own tents."

WHY SHOULD WE FAST?

Fasting is a religious discipline by which we restrain ourselves from the allurements of bodily pleasures and other forms of sinful inclinations in order to achieve spiritual goals that help us overcome the calamities of life.

Throughout human history we find that people whom God called to enter into special relationship with him to be used for his purpose fasted. These people include: Moses, David, Elijah, Esther, Daniel, Anna, Paul, just to name a few.

When Jesus taught on fasting, he would say "When you fast" not "If you fast;" he assumed that we would fast. We were created with fasting. Think about it, if you sleep 8 hours a day, then you are sleeping 1/3 of your life. If you live, say, 75 years, that's 25 years asleep, or 9.125 days. When you sleep, you are fasting, that's why morning meal is called breakfast – it is when you break your fast.

So we should fast for the following reasons:

We follow Jesus' example when we fast. Before beginning his ministry, Jesus fasted for forty days and forty nights in the desert. This period of fasting strengthened him to overcome the temptations Satan sought to lure him to fall into (cf. Mt 4:4-11). This example of Jesus is the main reason the Church also puts forth a forty-day period of fasting in preparation for the celebration of Easter.

Fasting also serves to obtain for us God's mercy and his pardon for our sins. We find an example of this in Scripture where the whole inhabitants of the city of Nineveh fasted to escape the wrath of God upon the preaching of the Prophet Jonah. (Jonah 3:6-10)

Again, fasting helps us renew our connection with God and makes us worthy of his favor.

Jesus said that His disciples will fast when He is gone (Mark 2:20). When we fast, we get our hunger back for the presence of God.

Furthermore, fasting helps us defeat demons.

Once, the disciples of Jesus could not cast out a demon. Jesus said, "This kind does not leave, but by prayer and fasting" (Matthew 17:21). Fasting helps to break the bonds of wickedness, undo heavy burdens, and empower us to break every yoke (Isaiah 58:6).

It is a church regulation that at least for an hour before receiving the Eucharist, all communicants should not anything. Even for our physical health, it is recommended that we have intermittent fasting in between meals. These reasons mentioned above make fasting a necessary discipline for our spiritual and physical wellbeing.

DID JESUS EXIST BEFORE HE WAS BORN? JESUS IS FULLY GOD AND FULLY MAN, HOW DO YOU EXPLAIN THAT IN SIMPLE TERMS?

These are two questions but they will have one answer.

Jesus, the second person of the Blessed Trinity, pre-existed in heaven as the eternal Word of God. The beginning of the Gospel of John states this truth unequivocally:

"In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God... and the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth." (cf. Jn 1:1-2; 14)

What the text above means is that Jesus is God; and as God he existed before the foundation of the world. In order to save humanity from our sins, he humbly and obediently accepted the Father's will to come from heaven down to this earth and take on a human flesh and form. This truth is also stated clearly in the letter of Paul to the Philippians.

"Though he was in the form of God, Jesus did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness..." (Phil 2:6-11)

In becoming a human being, he laid in the womb of a woman (The Blessed Virgin Mary), through the power of the Holy Spirit, for nine months and he was born as a human being. Through this he assumed a human nature and united that with his pre-existent God (Divine) nature. The God nature and the Human nature become inextricably united in the one person Jesus. For this same fact of the union of the God and human nature, Mary is also called the Mother of God because the child she conceived was God even in the womb. She gave flesh to the pre-existent Word (which is God) in her womb.

To save humans, Jesus needed to enter fully into the human situation and condition but to be able to accomplish the salvation too he needed to maintain the "Godness" in him because it takes God to save humans.

This union of the God (Divine) nature with the human nature is what we celebrate each year as Christmas- God becoming man (Incarnation) and dwelling among us as a native in our human world (Nativity).

Faith Formation

Today we hear how Jesus welcomes the children to come to him. Jesus' disciples had seen how people brought children to Jesus for him to bless them, but the disciples were scolding the parents because they felt the children were going to bother Jesus. Jesus saw this and got angry and said, "Let the children come to me, and do not stop them, because the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these, and whoever does not receive the Kingdom of God like a child will never enter it". Jesus wants us to be like how children are when first born, they are innocent and they're pure at heart. We all should have our hearts to be open and loving to one another. We are loved by Jesus no matter what age we are.
















HEAP Early Outreach

The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) will open on 10/1/21 this year for 'early outreach.' HEAP can help pay your energy bill using an income-based criteria to qualify. The 'early outreach' group covers households that received a 2020-2021 benefit as well as households with seniors, children under aged 6, and disabled persons. Applications can be in person, by mail, by fax or online via www.mybenefits.ny.gov.

Overdue gas and/or electric account?

HEAP is offering a one-time benefit available to their eligible households that have an electric/gas account in arrears. This benefit is called "RAS" (Regular Arrears Supplement) and is available from September 22, 2021 through September 30, 2022 or until funds are exhausted. Applicants must meet HEAP requirements and have a past-due utility bill in active collections or facing termination of service. Apply by phone at 800-342-3009 or in-person at the Social Services office.
