Baptism, a Sacred and Extraordinary Moment

The debate continues to rage on: when do the decorations come down? When is Christmas over? Liturgically and officially? In the old days, we would see evidence of the Christmas bundles at the curb in front of the houses on the block with wrapping paper, wreaths, and really dried out trees! Another indication came from ladders and brave dads scurrying up on the roof of households to remove the strings of lights until next year. But the Church wisely gives us seasons and feast days to mark the beginning and end of these precious times of the year.

This weekend, as the Church celebrates the Baptism of the Lord, it is important to know that Jesus did not need baptism for purification from sin. From early on the Church taught that it was Christ who actually sanctifies the waters for all of us. When Jesus humbly stepped into the Jordan and allowed John to baptize Him, He revealed the pathway of salvation and begins His public ministry. In Matthew's Gospel, the heavens open, the Spirit descends, and the Father's voice proclaims, "This is my beloved Son." That same declaration is proclaimed over every one of us at our baptism, it is where our faith journey with God begins.

For me, September 17, 1971 remains the most important day of my life. It was the day my parents carried me to St. Patrick's Church in Bay Ridge, and my uncle, Fr. Robert Emmett Hearn, baptized me. That moment began a relationship that will last for eternity. Years ago, a wise and faithful Catholic woman challenged me to know my baptismal date as deliberately as my birthday (August 30) or my priestly ordination anniversary (June 9). Do you know your baptismal date? Perhaps this week you might sit together as a family, open that folder or filing cabinet, search through old papers, or scroll through your phone to find it and write it down. Your baptismal day is the day you were claimed for Christ - named, loved, and forever marked as God's own.

Our baptism reveals our deepest identity. Before anything we do, we belong. We are beloved sons and daughters of God, marked with a dignity that nothing can erase - no sin, no failure, no season of uncertainty. Yet the world constantly measures us by usefulness and productivity: what we do, what we produce, what we contribute. Even within the Church, we can fall into the temptation of defining ourselves by ministries, contributions, and roles. These works are beautiful and necessary, but they are not who we are. As Isaiah reminds us, the Servant of the Lord is chosen and upheld by God, gentle and faithful, bringing justice not by force but by love. Our worth is rooted not in function, with achievement or effort, but in relationship.

I am continually inspired by those parishioners who quietly witness to this truth each day - those who come to daily Mass or sit faithfully in Eucharistic Adoration. To the world, it may look like they are "doing nothing." But they know otherwise. As many have shared with me, "Father, I look at Him, and He looks at me." In that sacred gaze, they place their joys and wounds, their families and fears, the parish and the world. They leave knowing, deep in their hearts, that they are seen, cared for, and loved. This is baptismal faith lived simply and profoundly.

As we enter what the Catholic Church identifies as Ordinary Time in 2026, I invite you to slow down and rediscover what is truly "ordinary" in the life of faith. Inspired by Isaiah 42 and the Baptism of Jesus in Matthew, let us embrace a life of humble service that flows from knowing we are "BELOVED" and then permit ourselves to 'BE LOVED' by God. Make room for more Jesus time - time in prayer, silence, Scripture, and His presence. Let this new year and season be less about what we do for God and more about allowing ourselves to be tenderly loved by Him. And just maybe, when we live from the core of our baptismal identity; the ordinary moments of our lives become, by God's grace, truly extraordinary.

When receiving Holy Orders, a man is ordained to serve the Church as a deacon, priest, or bishop. These ordained men guide and feed the faithful.

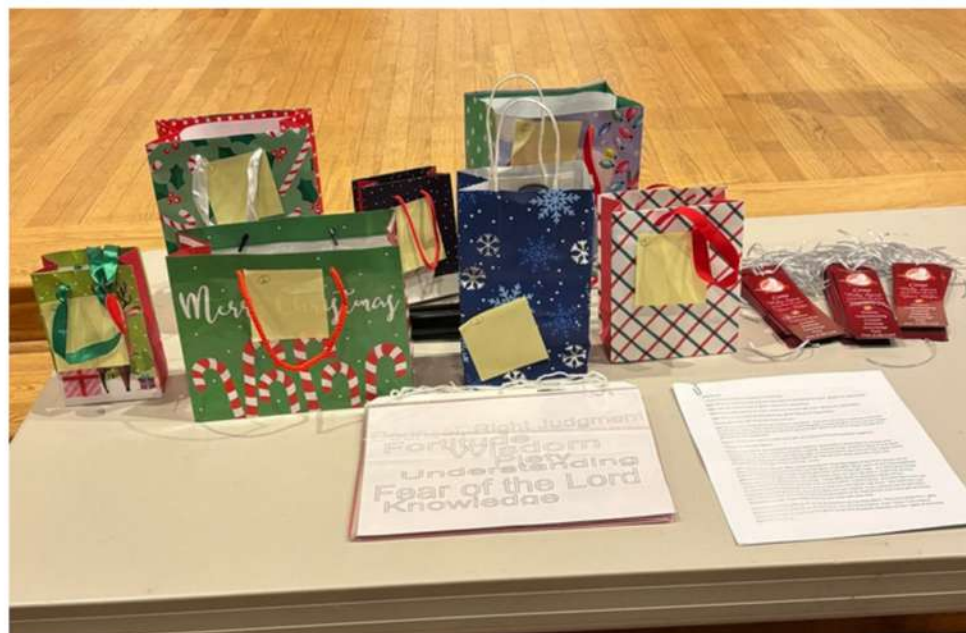


The Anointing of the Sick offers a special grace and forgiveness of sins for those who are seriously ill, elderly, or facing death.

The Nassau County Office for the Aging offers a case management program for seniors. Their program provides support for older adults to remain in their homes for as long as possible. They assist in providing in-home services for seniors through the Expanded In-home Services for the Elderly Program (EISEP). There are two types of in-home services offered, Level 1 which is housekeeping and chore services, and Level II which adds on personal care assistance such as bathing, dressing, toileting, grooming and feeding. Home Heating Assistance Available

Applications for obtaining HEAP benefits are currently being accepted! HEAP is the Home Energy Assistance Program, which helps low-income individuals and families pay for the cost of heating their homes. Eligibility and benefits are based on multiple criteria such as income, household size and heating source. If you are eligible, you may receive one regular HEAP benefit per program year. You could also be eligible for emergency HEAP benefits if you are in danger of running out of fuel or having your utility service shut off. 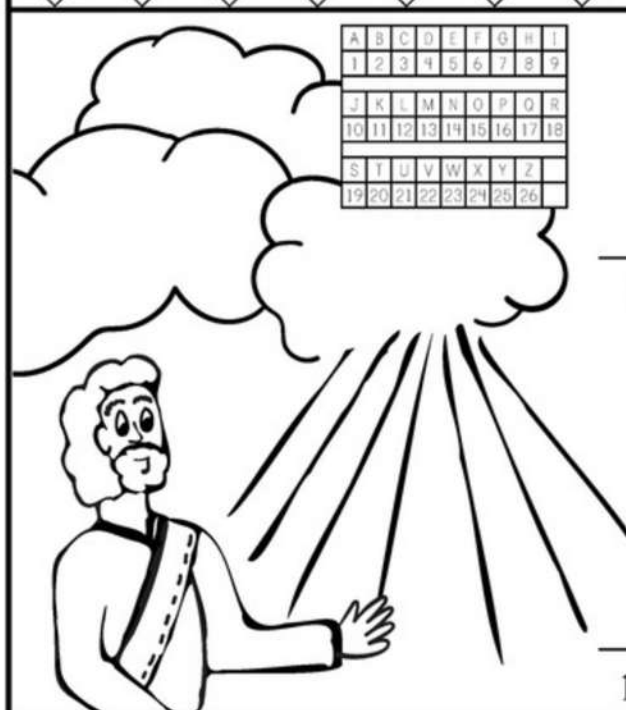
