

Catholic Schools Week - 2024

The National Catholic Education Association (NCEA) has provided a theme or motto each year for National Catholic Schools Week. This year, the theme is "United in Faith and Community!" A lived experience shared by us here at St. William the Abbot parish with the incredible love and support for our church and school. Our school community also has a yearly theme - "Become What You Believe," and in this time of a greater Eucharistic awareness and revival, that is a major focus for the school and parish. We proclaim it week after week in the Creed and live it by becoming Eucharistic disciples and stewards of God's gifts as we leave Mass each Sunday. All of us are called to leave an imprint and impact on the world and Church to strengthen it for the next generation.

St. William the Abbot School has done that for almost 70 years, forming and guiding young souls who have gone on to serve our community, nation, world, and, most importantly, the Church. Our foundation in the dedication and witness of the Ursuline Sisters and so many devoted lay women and men have contributed to our Catholic school's advantage and polish. In my time as pastor, I recognize that anytime we single out a group or ministry there may be some who feel separated or disconnected. It is the fact that people expect Jesus to be present when they step on the campus. That holiness is lived out in the classroom, in the hallways, on the playground, and even on the bus rides. Holiness is not perfection, but a striving to be set apart from the typical or ordinary this world has to offer in order grow in awareness and recognition of God's presence in ourselves, and others. That message, which is communicated first at home, is the central mission of Saint William the Abbot School!

Our commitment to sanctity and excellence has been the core of our existence for 70 years and we continue to thrive in 2024. We are inspired by our graduating 8th Graders moving on to the leading high schools on Long Island and are filled with hope by our underclassmen and strong response to our early childhood programs. I am often asked what are the variables that show a successful school or parish. Is it attendance? Collections? Or reserves in the bank? The "success" for us as a parish and school community is forming intentional disciples who live the Gospel. That is evident in the fruitful vocations of dedicated individuals, wives/mothers, husbands/fathers, religious, priests, and deacons who have walked through the halls of St. William's School.

I am grateful for the witness of so many of you who have made the commitment to Catholic school but also to Mass and serving the community. To see our students and families, present and engaged at Sunday and daily Mass is inspiring. The journey of faith is lived out over time and for some people, Catholic schools is a given. Christ-centered learning, strong curriculum, formation, and reinforcing core values of kindness, compassion, integrity, honesty, respect, and gratitude. For others, this may not be the season for you and your family. My hope is that this year if you have not previously considered Catholic school, that you would pray and discern if God is inviting you here in the Fall of 2024. We are St. William's... a tradition and legacy of 70 years of our parish history, but also a bright future set solidly on the rock of faith, family, and academic excellence!

If time allows, join us for Open House this weekend after the 10:30 Mass or make an appointment to experience SWS - Guided by Faith and Inspired to Excel.










St. William the Abbot School

January 28, 2024 Catholic Schools Week

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Access to Home Program

Do you or someone you know need home improvements such as ramps, grab bars, bathroom renovations, stair glides, doorway expansions, etc.? Community Development Center of Long Island has notified us that they have funding available in their Access to Home Program. This program targets individuals living with a physical disability or having substantial difficulty with daily living activities due to aging. It provides income eligible households with the resources (up to 25k) to make



necessary repairs and modifications to sustain one's safety and independence in the household and make the home more accessible. Some program spots are specifically reserved for Veterans and Medicaid recipients! If you are interested, please contact the Social Ministry office for more information and an application.

Nassau County Warming Centers

If you are having trouble with your heat, there are three warming centers open in Nassau County. Mitchel Field Administration Building in Uniondale offers a 24-hour Warming Center for anyone that needs to stop in and warm up. In addition, both the Wantagh Administration Building on King Road and the Cantiague Park Administration Building in Hicksville offer warming centers from 9am – 4pm daily. These local daytime warming centers provide transportation to the Uniondale location for evening service. Individuals requiring shelter overnight can call 1-866-WARMBED, the Nassau County winter homeless hotline. For more information, contact the Parish Social Ministry office.

Prayer Sbawl Ministry

The next meeting of the Prayer Shawl Ministry will be on Tuesday February 6 at 10am in the Abbey. This ministry knits and crochets lap robes, blankets, hats, scarves, and other items for the sick and needy of our community. Yarn is provided, and new members at any skill level are always welcome!



Home Heating Assistance Available

Applications for obtaining HEAP benefits are currently being accepted. HEAP is the Home Energy Assistance Program, which helps low-income individuals and families pay for the cost of heating their homes. Eligibility and benefits are based on multiple criteria such as income, household size and heating source. If you are eligible, you may receive one regular HEAP benefit per program year. You could also be eligible for emergency HEAP benefits if you are in danger of running out of fuel or having your utility service shut off.
