Bethany – A place of Rest



In the scriptures Jesus often refers to the town of Bethany to be a place of retreat and rest for him. It was the town where his dear friends Lazarus, Martha, and Mary lived, as well as Simon the leper. Bethany would be a common place for him to retreat either before or after entering Jerusalem, to recharge his batteries and to just simply be with friends. This past week I had the blessing of being at the Bethany Retreat Center located in Tampa Florida participating in my canonical retreat. Canonical is a "churchy" word for a legal expectation. All clergy (Deacons, Priests, and Bishops) are required to do a yearly retreat for 5 to 8 days to remain connected to the SOURCE. The wisdom of the Church tells us to look at the scriptures and the life of Jesus, how he often pulled away to recharge – the 40 days in the desert, the moments of quiet prayer before and after ministry. I have done just that and will return to St. William this Sunday night (January 30th), just as we enter into this Catholic Schools week. Before you know it, we will be heading into Ash Wednesday and the Season of Lent. Father James, our Deacons, and amazing staff will be here to serve all our spiritual needs for the parish and the school, and you will see a few priest friends of ours helping out as well.

Please be assured of my prayer for all of you, and I would ask that you pray for me that this will be a time of restoration and renewal.

Please do not leave any food donations in the Church.






According to tradition, Blaise was of noble birth, became a physician, was educated in the Catholic faith and eventually became bishop of Sebastia, a city in Turkey. Blaise was martyred in 316 AD for the crime of being a Christian. The feast of Saint Blaise is observed on February 3.

We know more about the devotion to Saint Blaise than we know about the saint himself. He was know to be a very holy priest. Legend has it that a mother came to Blaise with her young son, who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. Through Blaise's prayers, the child was able to cough up the bone. Thereafter, St. Blaise became the patron for the cure of throat illnesses. Many Catholics have long sought the annual Saint Blaise blessing of their throats.

In honor of the Feast Day of St. Blaise on Thursday February 3, 2022 there will be a blessing of the throats at the end of the 8:30 AM Mass.







As she grew up, she realized that slavery was illegal in Italy, so she was free! She became Catholic and joined a convent.
