# THE FOUR PARTS OF THE MASS

#### INTRODUCTORY RITES

These essentially consist of the entrance procession and song, a greeting, the Sign of the Cross, the Penitential Act where we acknowledge our sins and ask for forgiveness, the Gloria to proclaim our praise and love of God, and an opening prayer.

## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

This is an opportunity for us to hear and reflect on the word of God through the readings and Gospel, the homily, and prayers we recite together. After the homily we make a profession of faith and recite the Creed as a community. The Liturgy of the Word also includes the Prayers of the Faithful (also known as General Intercessions), and the collection, which is a real and practical expression of our love and helps the parish continue our ministries.

### THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

This is the apex - high point - of the Mass. The gifts of bread and wine are presented and prepared, we hear the Eucharistic Prayer, recite the "Our Father" as one voice, and we witness the miracle of the Consecration together before we receive the gift of the Eucharist. The Liturgy of the Eucharist is the "center and summit of the entire celebration" and defines who we are as Catholic Christians.

### **CONCLUDING RITES**

After Communion and an opportunity for quiet prayer and reflection, we begin the Concluding Rites. In this portion of the Mass, you may hear some announcements or reminders for things happening in the parish or Diocese. We then receive the final blessing and dismissal, where we are all instructed to "go in peace" and spread our love of God to others through our words and actions.





# Stop Physician-Assisted Suicide in New York

New York is on the brink of legalizing physician-assisted suicide.

Bill A136 has already passed the Senate and Assembly. The only thing standing in its way is Governor Hochul's veto — and she needs to hear from you.

This bill would allow doctors to prescribe lethal medication with the sole purpose of ending a patient's life. It puts the most vulnerable among us — the elderly, people with disabilities, and those facing emotional or financial despair — at even greater risk. **Suicide is not healthcare.** 

We must speak out to protect the dignity of every human life. Assisted suicide is a dangerous and deadly path — one we must not go down.



## Yarn Donations Needed


