Jesus Sent Them Out

The Gospel this Sunday reveals to us how the Lord desires to pass on the Apostolic gifts and talents to his followers from the very beginning. The mission continues for us today as well. We are sent out, both individually and as families to proclaim the Good News. In fact, the word 'Mass' comes from the final blessing said by the priest in Latin 'Ite missa es' meaning "to send out" as was modeled in the scriptures - out into the world to take his teaching to all the nations. There is a wisdom to entering into the mission field with a companion for the journey to encourage, to challenge, and simply to be present for one another. Jesus knew the importance and the strength that comes with community. Although we have entered the summer months, the parish continues to carry on this very important mission even though these "dog days" allow for much needed rest and vacation for all of us, parishioners, and clergy alike. But the Lord desires us to stay connected to Him, to His word and Sacraments. How can we advance the mission in the Summer of 2024?

Can I encourage you to embrace the "Three Pillars" of our parish this summer by participating in the Sacraments, being attentive to the needy and most vulnerable, and being open to forming/growing/educating your faith experience this Summer? These will all help us grow as Catholic Missionary Disciples.


- 1. When celebrating the sacraments, arrive early, prepare your heart for Mass, or confession, or the anointing of the sick. We can do that by reading the daily or Sunday scriptures beforehand or looking at an examination of conscience for a thorough, good confession. When we do this, we go from the tendency of rushing and going through the motions, to an intentional encounter with Jesus in the Sacraments.
- 2. Thanks to our Parish Social Ministry Team, you do not have to look far for some of the significant needs of the less fortunate in our community and here on Long Island. We recognize that for many of us the summer allows for travel and vacation, but the needs of the most vulnerable do not end. If you have not shared in the past, please consider our pantry needs or perhaps sharing the surplus of your backyard gardens to provide fresh vegetables to our clients.
- 3. The Summer Tuesday Night Series has been set up for us to experience a fun, social gathering, but also to learn a little more about our faith, the parish and each other. This week will be a bit of a Summer Olympic preview with our Family Field Night, and you may just have the opportunity to meet an Olympian! But over the next few weeks we will have a Trivia Night (with a surprise special guest presenter) and a Family Scavenger Hunt of the Holy Sites revealing more about St. William and our parish history. More information and details about registering for the events are in the following pages.

If I am going to encourage and challenge you to go on mission this summer, then of course I must be open to that myself. As I had recently mentioned, Bishop Barres and the US Bishop's Conference is sending me to France to participate in a Catholic event that is leading into the Summer Olympics called the Holy Games. The initiative will begin the week before the Olympics and continue throughout the Paralympics to engage not only the Olympians, but also those who will come to support and watch them participate. There will be an opportunity for catechesis/teaching, adoration and celebration of the sacraments, service and outreach to the poor, and also counseling and support of the athletes. My role will be to assist the Archdiocese of Paris and the chaplain priests, religious, and lay faithful in their very important mission. I have been asked to celebrate Mass, share my own Olympic witness story, and be present to the United States Olympians, but I have been also asked to investigate how we too can model this experience in four years from now when the Olympic Games will return to the US in Los Angeles 2028 and then present that report to Bishop Barres and the USCCB. I will leave this week and return in early August. Please pray for me.

As always, thank you for your presence and generosity.



Senior Care Through the Office for the Aging

There are two types of in-home services offered, Level 1 which is housekeeping and chore services, and Level II which adds on personal care assistance such as bathing, dressing, toileting, grooming and feeding.
