"Lord, teach us how to pray!"

Even as the summer months stretch on and many of our parish programs take a bit of a breather, the rhythm of prayer and worship at St. William the Abbot never truly stops. The doors of our church remain open and, more importantly, the heart of God remains open to us. The 17th Sunday of Ordinary Time invites us to reflect on one of the most beautiful gifts Jesus gives to His followers - the invitation to pray. In this weekend's Gospel from Luke, the Apostles ask Jesus, "Lord, teach us to pray." That same request echoes in our own hearts today, whether we are seasoned in prayer or experiencing a spiritual renewal, Jesus welcomes us with the same loving attention.

Who taught you to pray? For many of us, it was a parent or grandparent who knelt beside us at the foot of our bed and gently led us through the Sign of the Cross, the Our Father, or the Hail Mary. I remember as a child tracing the cross on my forehead, chest, and shoulders, not fully knowing the depth of what I was doing but sensing that it was sacred. I watched my parents and older siblings back in our home on 94th Street in Bay Ridge, Brooklyn and was especially awe-struck walking into Saint Patrick's Church on 4th Avenue; maybe your earliest memories of prayer were in a pew at Sunday Mass, drawn in by the body of Jesus on the Crucifix, or the beautiful faces of the Mary and Joseph statues on either side of the altar. Did someone guide your unsteady hand to light a candle for someone you loved? Or maybe it was the words of a familiar hymn or the reading of Scripture that stirred something deep within you. We too were once shown 'how to pray'.

Jesus reminds us today that prayer doesn't have to be complicated. In fact, He keeps it beautifully simple. God is not far off - He is close, tender, and attentive, like a good Father. Jesus doesn't just teach a formula; He opens us to a relationship. When we say, "Our Father," we are not reciting poetry - we are entering into a conversation with the One who made us and loves us. And Jesus goes further, urging us to ask, seek, and knock with a promising response from the One who loves us. At the same time, the true fruit of our prayer is not always in changing God's mind, but in how *our* hearts are changed by being in God's presence and in HIS gaze.

As Catholics, we have a rich tradition of prayer to guide us when we don't know what to say. The Church identifies five basic forms of prayer: blessing and adoration, petition, intercession, thanksgiving, and praise. If you ever find yourself unsure of how to pray or what to say, start with one of these forms – ask, seek, and knock – know that our loving Father is just waiting for us. But know this as well, even silence before the Blessed Sacrament is a profound prayer. In Eucharistic Adoration, it becomes a time for two loved ones to simply look upon and be with each other.

This summer is a perfect time to rekindle that spark of prayer - whether you're on the beach, in the backyard, or traveling with family. Find a quiet moment, light a candle in church, visit 7:15 morning Adoration, or pray the rosary while walking on the boardwalk. So many of you have shared your love for praise and worship music with Catholic artists like Matt Maher and Sarah Kroger, so make a playlist or tune into Sirius XM station "The Message" for positive, faith-based music – it is a wonderful way to pray! The important thing is not how polished our words are, but that we make space for God in our day. Prayer opens our hearts to grace and reminds us that we are never, ever alone.

May this week be an opportunity for each of us to return to the simple beauty of talking with God. Let us be persistent, like the one who knocks in today's Gospel, knowing that our Heavenly Father is not only listening - but longing to respond. May God Bless you!



ABOUT OUR PROGRAM

- Our program is on developing a life-long relationship between your family and Jesus through Christ-centered lessons and in the communal celebration of the Eucharist each week
- Sacramental preparation are two-year programs: children must complete Levels 1 and 2 before receiving First Holy Communion and Levels 7 and 8 before receiving Confirmation
- Program discount is available for parent volunteers

NEW/TRANSFER FAMILIES

Students who previously attended another program must have a transfer letter sent to the Office of Faith Formation by their former parish

MASS ATTENDANCE

All children are required to attend 75% of Sunday/Holy Days of Obligation Masses between September and May and check-in using the QR codes in the church in order to complete their grade level and receive sacraments

SCHEDULE

- Level 2: Parent-Lead at Home (September-December) & Weekly In-Person Classes (January-April)
- Levels 3-6: Meet Weekly In-Person at SWS

Luau Luncbeon




Free Concerts for Seniors







