Wine and Hosts

The Wine and Hosts used at Mass this week have been donated in honor of the Parishioners of St. William the Abbot As we find ourselves in the sacred days between the Ascension and the great feast of Pentecost, I invite you to reflect with me on the beauty and power of this time. Jesus, in ascending to the Father, did not leave us orphaned, forgotten, or alone. He promised us the Advocate - the Holy Spirit - who would empower us to be His witnesses "to the ends of the earth." As a parish family, we are called to open our hearts as we anticipate this divine gift, allowing the Spirit to renew, transform, and guide our future. I am reminded of our Confirmation ceremonies from just a few weeks ago when Bishop Coyle encouraged and challenged our young disciples to be keepers of the family faith and traditions, but also to put their mark on the Church. As a parish community, we too prepare in prayer and expectation for Pentecost, ready to be set on fire with God's love.

We will have an opportunity to do that next Sunday, June 8th, when our Diocese hosts a powerful event that beautifully aligns with this spirit of renewal: the Eucharistic Congress at St. Anthony's High School. Bishop John Barres will be gathering with the faithful from across Long Island for a day filled with grace - celebration of the Holy Mass, inspiring speakers, vocations talks, opportunities for confession, and activities for all ages. I strongly encourage you to join me in this historic event for the Church on Long Island. This is a chance to encounter Christ in the Eucharist in a profound and communal way with other dedicated disciples and missionaries who share the same fervor and love for the Lord and the mission of the Catholic Church.

I believe the Holy Spirit is moving in a profound way – in the global church, with the election of Pope Leo XIV, in the Diocese with the Eucharistic Congress, and here on the local level at SWA. Recently, our parish was blessed with the opportunity to participate in a 'Listening Session' to assess our parochial gifts and our needs journeying closer to our centennial. We began the night with adoration and quiet prayer and then entered into a Q&A with some of the important questions and concerns on the mind of so many of you. I want to express my heartfelt gratitude to the 80+ parishioners, ministry leaders, teachers, volunteers, staff, and clergy from St. William the Abbot who gave their time and insights. Your faith, honesty, and vision for our Church were a gift, and I believe the graces from this process will continue to shape our community life, ministry, and outreach well into the summer and beyond.

The evening was moderated by Deacon Ray D'Alessio and navigated some of the trends and changes that have occurred in the "Church" and in our parish over the past 10-15 years. We looked at current and past ministries, Mass attendance, number of clergy (priests and deacons), stewardship, the effect of COVID, and some projections into the future. I have collected significant data and feedback which will help me to discern how we move the parish forward with input from the Finance and Parish Councils. My hope is to offer a brief report in the next few weeks and then look for more dates to pray, dream, and discern where the Holy Spirit is leading us.

Though the academic year winds down and summer approaches, our faith journey continues to deepen. The rhythms may slow, but the Spirit remains active and alive. Let this summer be a time not just of rest, but of renewal – how may the Lord be moving you to reconnect with Him through prayer, the sacraments, or the beauty of art, literature, and creation. Be attentive to some of our summer activities like the Feast of St. William the Abbot (June 25th), as well as summer Masses, adoration, and faith-filled gatherings. The Lord desires to meet you in every season.

Come, Holy Spirit! Enkindle in us the fire of Your love, and renew the face of the earth—beginning right here in Seaford.


