## **Congratulations Reverend Father Herley Mendez**

In May of 1993, as a recent college graduate, I began a long-term sub position at North Babylon High School – where I went to high school. It was an odd experience returning home to my former teachers and coaches, no longer saying: “Mr.” or “Mrs.” or “Coach” – the formal greeting you would give a teacher. Now, I was there as a peer, and I was challenged with how to address them – by their first name? Terry, Jack, Maggie, Barry, Barbara... It was initially awkward, but I was attentive and able to watch and listen gaining wisdom, experience, and insight from these once-admired mentors who quickly became colleagues and friends.

Well, the priesthood has a similar transition, we have journeyed here at St. William the Abbot with “Seminarian” Herley for many years and beginning this weekend – upon his ordination - he becomes “Father” Herley. For me too, there is a change. He has referred to me as “Father Joe” for close to 8 years as his spiritual father, but now we become brothers in this amazing priestly fraternity. So, as a big brother, I thought I would write him a letter of encouragement – from an older, more seasoned priest – ordained now 19 years – to a rookie. So, here goes:

*Father Herley,*

*As you begin your priesthood, remember first that you were not ordained because you are perfect, but because Jesus called you. Never lose the wonder of that. There will be days when the parish is full of joy and gratitude, and there will be days when you feel tired, misunderstood, or alone. In both moments, stay close to the tabernacle – Jesus is truly there. The people of God will remember your homilies at times, but even more, they will remember whether you loved them, visited them, buried their loved ones, baptized their children, and stood beside them when their crosses became heavy. Trust me, they will form you better than any seminary faculty!*

*Fiercely guard and protect your prayer life. It's funny, the world will reward activity and efficiency, but a priest without prayer slowly becomes a hollow man with no depth. Stay connected to the SOURCE - spend time before the Blessed Sacrament even when you “feel” nothing; especially then. Your priesthood will not ultimately be measured by accomplishments, monuments, or popularity, but by fidelity to Our Lord and His Mission – like St. Francis of Assisi – passionately preach the Gospel, and when necessary - use words!*

*Be holy - but also be kind to those entrusted to you – parishioners, coworkers, and those serving with you in the vineyard. Answer the phone, return messages, and RSVP when you are invited to the events of people's lives. Visit the nursing home and bless the children - remember we are called to serve at the creche and the tomb. Teach the faith clearly and courageously, but never without gentleness, tenderness, and charity. The people do not need a celebrity that is trending; they need a spiritual father who accompanies them.*

*You will also discover that priesthood is lived in sacrifice. Some days you will return from an overflowing church on Sunday to an empty rectory after pouring yourself out for others. Offer that loneliness to Jesus. He understands it – He has been there, and He is with you... always. Guard your heart carefully. Stay close to brother priests who strengthen your vocation. Never allow cynicism to take root; it destroys more priests than exhaustion ever will. Laugh often, keep healthy friendships, and remember that joy is one of the greatest witnesses a priest can offer to a weary world. Be a happy priest! Well, Herley, I think you have that one covered!*

*Finally, never forget whose priest you are. At ordination, your hands were consecrated for the Eucharist. At every Mass, you celebrate heaven and earth coming together upon the altar. Even after many years, I still shudder quietly at the words of consecration. God does not call the qualified, He qualifies the called. Remain close to Jesus in the Eucharist, entrust yourself daily to Our Lady, and your priesthood will bear fruit in ways you may never fully see in this lifetime. Be faithful, Father Herley... and don't worry, Jesus will do the rest.*



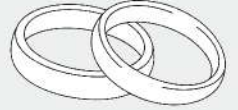

## THE PATH TO PRIESTHOOD



### DISCERNMENT

Vocation means “call.” It is an invitation to love and to be loved by the God who created you. We do not create our own vocation, rather it is given to us by God. He reveals it to us in the depth of our heart and we are free to respond. He does not force it on us. Men being called to the priesthood are invited to meet with their parish priests, pastor, and diocesan Vocations Director.

### SEMINARY

Typically, men entering the seminary already hold their bachelor’s degree before embarking on their formal formation in the seminary where formation is broken up into 4 stages:

#### *Propaedeutic Stage -*

This is generally a 1 year stage where men are introduced to the seminary and focus on developing their prayer life, introductory coursework, fraternity with fellow seminarians, and determine their openness to formation.

#### *Discipleship Stage -*

This stage, which lasts at least 2 years - but the total duration depends on a man’s educational and life background - helps seminarians deepen their relationship with Jesus through meditation, contemplation, and moral formation. Coursework includes classes in the history of ancient, medieval, and modern philosophy, metaphysics, ethics, philosophical anthropology, Latin, Biblical Greek, and Spanish. Seminarians at this stage also engage in practical apostolic experiences such as ministry in parishes, schools, hospitals, and community programs.

#### *Configuration Stage -*

This third stage focuses on 4 pillars of formation - human, spiritual, academic, and pastoral. Seminarians study the history of the Church, pastoral theology, and develop skills in preaching, counseling, catechesis, and evangelization. It is also during this stage that seminarians begin official assignments to a parish (affectionately nicknamed “student-priesting”) to gain practical insights through observation, participation, and collaboration with priests, parishioners, and parish ministries. This stage can last 3-4 years and sees a seminarian become a Candidate for Holy Orders, Lector, and Acolyte.

#### *Vocational Synthesis -*

After completing the Configuration Stage, a seminarian petitions their bishop to become a transitional deacon, the last step before priesthood. As a transitional deacon, seminarians can further participate in the Mass, celebrate baptisms, and deliver blessings. In the Diocese of Rockville Centre, this is typically a 6-month stage.
