### Beloved Daughters and Sons of the Holy Trinity

What a beautiful and grace-filled week it has been in the life of our Diocese! I want to express my heartfelt gratitude to all who participated in last week's Diocesan Eucharistic Congress events. Whether you walked in the Eucharistic Procession, joined in prayer and worship at St. Anthony's High School, or attended the closing Mass with Bishop Barres, thank you. Your presence and prayerful participation are a powerful witness to the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist and a sign of our unity as the Body of Christ on Long Island. It was moving to see our parishioners - young and the more seasoned faithful - gathered with thousands of others to rekindle our love for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

Pentecost Sunday was also a celebration here in the parish with another tremendous moment of grace - the Confirmation of our newly initiated sisters in Christ: Nadine, Shannon, and Josephine. Please join me in congratulating those who received the Sacrament, as well as their families and sponsors who have supported them on this journey. I am especially proud of our OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) team, Deacon Mike, Jo-Ann, Lara, and Maria who have guided, taught, and prayed with them with such dedication and example. These Confirmations remind us that the Holy Spirit is still very active and alive here on the south shore of Long Island at our small country parish community. May the fire of the Holy Spirit call each of us to deeper faith and to be courageous witnesses to speak about and invite others into relationship with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

This weekend we mark the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, one of the central mysteries of our faith. Though we may never fully comprehend the Trinity - God reveals Himself to us as a communion of love. In this divine mystery, we are not just observers, but summoned to be participants and active followers. The Holy Trinity calls us into a relationship and then into action. God longs for each of us to go deeper with each person of the Trinity: The Father who created us, the Son who redeems us, and the Spirit who sanctifies and sends us forth. As Pope St. John Paul II said so beautifully, "God in His deepest mystery is not a solitude but a family, since He has in Himself fatherhood, sonship and the essence of the family, which is love."

As we reflect on the love shared within the Trinity, it is only fitting that we also celebrate our earthly fathers this Sunday. It has been a about a year and a half since my dad died, and I miss him still, but I am so grateful for every moment I had with him. He was a great father who always pointed me to the Heavenly Father. To all the dads, grandfathers, godfathers, and spiritual fathers in our parish - Happy Father's Day! May God bless you abundantly for the love, guidance, and strength you offer your families. You are an image of God's tender fatherly care and a vital part of our parish family. We thank God for you and pray for your continued strength and quest for holiness.

I want to also offer a warm congratulations to all of our graduates - from pre-schoolers and 'kinders' moving up, to our eighth graders and high school seniors preparing for new beginnings. Know that your parish family is proud of you. We are praying for you as you take your next steps with courage and faith. May you always keep Christ at the center of your life and never forget that your parish is always here for you.

As we draw deeper into the summer and the longest day of the year, I encourage you to remember the mission of the parish – to enhance your relationship and knowledge of God – and then to invite and tell others. The summer often pulls us away from St. William the Abbot, as we are blessed to be invited to graduation parties, beach and boating excursions, and of course vacation destinations which refresh and restore our minds and bodies. Our soul also hungers for renewal, and as you plan ahead, carve out prayer time each day, read and listen to spiritual authors, and be sure to schedule Mass as part of your weekly summer schedule – whether here or when on vacation. The feast day of St. William the Abbot is approaching on June 25th – mark your calendars – and join us and invite others for the Mass, or volunteer to cover one of the carnival game booths, or bring your sing-along voice to the summer tunes! It will be a wonderful celebration!



# **ABOUT OUR PROGRAM**

- Our program is on developing a life-long relationship between your family and Jesus through Christ-centered lessons and in the communal celebration of the Eucharist each week
- Sacramental preparation are two-year programs: children must complete Levels 1 and 2 before receiving First Holy Communion and Levels 7 and 8 before receiving Confirmation
- Program discount is available for parent volunteers

### **NEW/TRANSFER FAMILIES**

Students who previously attended another program must have a transfer letter sent to the Office of Faith Formation by their former parish

### MASS ATTENDANCE

All children are required to attend 75% of Sunday/Holy Days of Obligation Masses between September and May and check-in using the QR codes in the church in order to complete their grade level and receive sacraments

### SCHEDULE

- Level 1: Parent-Lead at Home
- Level 2: Parent-Lead at Home (September-December) & Weekly In-Person Classes (January-April)
- Levels 3-6: Meet Weekly In-Person at SWS
- Levels 7-8: Meet Bi-Weekly In-Person in The Abbey






# Summer EBT Benefits for Children

To supplement the loss of free school meals during the summer break, your child may be eligible for a one-time summer EBT benefit of \$120 to help cover the cost of food. If you currently receive SNAP or Temporary Assistance, or if you are currently certified for free school lunch, you should be automatically enrolled in this program. If you do not meet these requirements, you can still apply for this benefit online. Applications will be reviewed to ensure they comply with the program's income thresholds.
