His passing in December has definitely had a profound effect on me, and although with great faith in Jesus Christ and the Resurrection and trusting that his soul is being tenderly cared for by God the Father, I of course miss him terribly. Father's Day was always an opportunity for my siblings and I to attempt to buy him a 'not so' stylish tie, or a playful greeting card with a silly message. I would like to say that we would prepare a delicious breakfast in bed with waffles, eggs, and bacon with freshly squeezed orange juice, but he wouldn't have it. My dad was the king of Sunday morning breakfast. He would prefer to make and serve all of us. At the depth of my priesthood, and my fatherhood, I pray with great humility to do the same for you all, my beloved parish family, with the sacred meal of the Eucharist.

For the parish of St. William the Abbot, as we celebrate Father's Day this Sunday, we have also been blessed with a 'new father', a spiritual father in Fr. Joseph Lettieri!!! 

To qualify you must have a documented medical condition that is aggravated by heat, and you must meet certain income guidelines.
