

# The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Corpus Christi 2024

"The Body of Christ." As Catholics, we are so familiar during Mass with this statement from the priest as we come forward for communion, and we faithfully respond "Amen!" This powerful action and statement of faith has been the central part of the mystery of our Catholic faith journey. So often we in the Church will speak about the Eucharist as the source and summit of our belief. Through the years the liturgy of the Eucharist has developed and evolved into the liturgical experience that we have each Sunday. What began as an ordinary celebration of the Passover meal was transformed into the sacred meal of the New Covenant. The disciples quickly noticed that the Last Supper would be a different type of meal, that the lamb of sacrifice was not present from the herds or the stalls of Jerusalem, but that as they gazed upon Jesus that night, they were beholding the presence of the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. That celebration continues and is "re"-presented here in Seaford each Sunday and every day at Mass.

On September 8, 1565, Father Francisco Lopez de Mendoza Grajales, celebrated Mass at what is known as the sacred acre in St. Augustine FL. He was entrusted with the spiritual care of the crew of the Indies Fleet led by Spanish Admiral Menendez de Aviles which set sail from Spain to discover the riches of the New World. The daily Eucharistic celebration has been offered at an altar on that spot for over 450 years - the Body of Christ has been made present. Saint William the Abbot is approaching 100 years as a parish community and has faced some of the most beautiful and challenging times in American history with a great love and devotion to the Eucharist. Each day I encounter the faithful of our parish at Adoration and Mass strengthening their faith and devotion, and of course lifting up our loved ones who are not as connected to the Body of Christ. There is hope, but also an awareness of a need for revival and rejuvenation within the Church.

The US Bishop's Conference has recently presented us with alarming statistics about Mass attendance and belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Mass attendance and active participation at most Catholic parishes in the US and on Long Island is about 30% and the grasping of belief and understanding in the Real Presence is a little below that statistical number! Bishop Robert Barron reminds us that "this study should be a wake-up call to all of us in the Church... my anger is not directed at the research organizers, but inward. I'm blaming myself, bishops, priests, and anybody responsible for transmitting the faith... we are all guilty. It's been a massive failure of the Church carrying on its own tradition." Our response to this of course must be to pause, to turn to the Lord in prayer, to ask, and to listen to His response of what to do next. We must especially do this during Mass and Eucharistic Adoration, the Lord will guide and direct us. The more we strengthen our personal devotion and love for the Eucharist, especially here at Saint William the Abbot in Seaford, then that will spread to our families, to the parish borders, and beyond. We certainly are not responsible to change the whole church, but we can intentionally grow in our understanding and love of the Eucharist right here.

The month of June will allow us to do just that, with many wonderful events occurring for us to gather in prayer and celebration of the Body of Christ. June is set aside and recognized as the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, remembering His humble offering on the cross for our sins. Saint William will be hosting one evening of the Diocesan Novena of Holy Hours across Long Island on Wednesday, June 5th at 7 PM. That will lead us into the ordination weekend of Father Joseph Lettieri on Saturday June 8th at St. Agnes Cathedral, followed by his first Mass of Thanksgiving here at 2:00 PM on Sunday June 9th. Along with our daily Adoration, as well as First Friday Adoration, we will culminate the month of the Sacred Heart with our Patronal Feast Day celebration on Tuesday June 25th, with Mass and a parish BBQ. I encourage you to participate in all or as many of the events that help us to honor and reverence Corpus Christi, the Sacred Body, and Blood of Jesus Christ.

My sisters and brothers we have been entrusted with a powerful mission to proclaim God's goodness and love, and that He desires to be with us in everything. He also desires for us to simply spend time with him, at Mass, and Adoration, in the scriptures, and in quiet time. As we kick off this 2024 Corpus Christi weekend, let us pray for a deeper desire to reverence and respect the Holy Eucharist. Let us pray that our devotion will inspire and lead others to an intimacy and love of the Lord.

As always, thank you for your generosity and presence, and let's continue to pray for one another.




SWS Middle Schoolers attended a presentation by NCPD Officer Yolanda Turner on cyber bullying and social media usage.
