#### HAPPY SAINT WILLIAM THE ABBOT DAY!

The Universal Church recognizes June 25th as the Feast Day of St. William the Abbot. St. William was born in Italy in the year 1085, and at a very early age had a deep connection with God and his Catholic faith. He was inspired to go on a few pilgrimages that took him to different parts of Europe, but what was the most deep in his heart was a journey to the Holy Land, to walk where Jesus walked. Along the journey to Israel, his plan was diverted by God's plan, and eventually he settled near Naples and began a community of monks at Monte Vergine. William desired to live more of a hermit-like existence, but his life of holiness drew other followers, and they created an Abbey that was a lighthouse of hope to the faithful peasants of that region and beyond. St. William was credited with miraculous stories of conversion, proclamation of the gospel, and the legendary story of the "Miracle of the Wolf". This year marks the 900th anniversary of this powerful story of the determined Abbot of Monte Virgine, and how the wolf assisted in the completion of the holy site.

On Wednesday, I too will celebrate an anniversary connected to St. William, my 5th anniversary as the pastor. Our church community is also approaching its 100th anniversary of existence, and we will begin a year of celebrations starting in the summer of 2026. The parish was officially dedicated in August of 1927, with about 50 total registered families. We now have close to 5000! This August we will also begin our 70th academic school year at St. William the Abbot School, which was founded by the Ursuline Sisters of Tildonk in 1954. So many of you have attended or your children and grandchildren are graduates and we are committed to keeping this legacy alive! Keep an eye out for upcoming events.

St. William the Abbot Day 2024 will be filled with spiritual and temporal food! We will gather as a parish to celebrate the 6pm mass in the church, followed by a parish barbeque in the back parking lot. We will have regular grilling items like hamburgers and hot dogs, cotton candy and popcorn, as well as activities and inflatables for the children. Please bring drinks and any extra snacks! I encourage you to arrive early with chairs and blankets to set up a space, and then come celebrate the mass to honor our patron.

I wanted you to be aware of a few other great opportunities involving me personally and the parish. I have been given the great honor to participate in two wonderful opportunities this summer. Most of you are familiar with the Seaford 9/11 Memorial at the High School which recognizes and remembers the five graduates who died on September 11, 2001. A scholarship fund and award was established to recognize graduating Seaford HS students who best exemplified the life and spirit of those heroic men who died during the attack on the World Trade Center. The Honorary Patriot Award is given to older community members, who to the best of their ability model those virtues. Many of our parishioners, leaders of ministries, and clergy from St. William have been nominated in the past, and this year I am blessed to be a part of that prestigious group.

In that patriotic spirit, Bishop Barres has also asked me to attend the 2024 Olympic Games in Paris to observe the spiritual presence at the Games. In the summer of 2028, the United States of America will host the Olympics in Los Angeles. The US Catholic Bishops are attempting to have a spiritual presence for the athletes and those who come to watch the Olympics four years from now. The Archdiocese of Paris has organized a number of events and activities for this summer, and Bishop Barres thought it best for me to go and experience it firsthand and bring back a report. Go USA!

Finally, you will also see an advertisement for an upcoming pilgrimage to Italy and the homeland of our patron, St. William the Abbot. When I first arrived here five years ago, I had a wonderful conversation with Father Bill (now Bishop Bill) and he encouraged me at some point to either make a personal visit to Monte Virgine, or to lead a pilgrimage there. The seed was planted in my heart, but unfortunately a global pandemic threw everything off. After a great deal of prayer and discernment, I thought what better than this year with so many high point anniversaries for our parish, our patron, and the Jubilee Year (2025)?! The pilgrimage will bring us to Naples, to the real "Abbey", to Assisi, and then of course to end in Rome with an audience with the Pope. I encourage you to pray about it and see if you would like to join me on this trip.

### **PSEG** Assistance Available

PSEG offers multiple programs to help customers facing financial hardship. They offer the Household Assistance Program (HAP) which can provide a \$40 monthly credit to your bill. If you already receive assistance such as HEAP, SNAP or SSI, or if you are on Medicaid, you may already qualify for HAP! In addition, PSEG offers the Residential Energy Affordability Partnership (REAP) where a technician will perform a free home energy survey to find opportunities for energy efficiency improvements intended to lower your energy costs. ### **HEAP Cooling Assistance Open!**

The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) helps people pay the cost of heating and cooling their homes. You can now apply for cooling assistance to buy and install an air conditioner or a fan for your home. To qualify you must have a documented medical condition that is aggravated by heat, and you must meet certain income guidelines.
