Happy Pentecost Sunday!

Today, we celebrate the great outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Church - a Spirit that continues to move powerfully in our parish, in our hearts, and across our Diocese. Pentecost Sunday, 50 days since the resurrection and the fulfillment of a promise that God will not leave us alone, the Advocate arrives 'like the calvary' to support, strengthen, advise, and protect us. What a blessing it is to be gathered in this sacred moment, asking the Lord to renew the face of the earth, starting with each one of us.

That renewal was evident last weekend as we were able to host a small portion of the Diocesan Eucharistic Procession – a very public display of our Catholic faith and identity. The grace-filled experience began in Rockville Centre and made its sacred way through Baldwin, Freeport, Merrick, and Bellmore - culminating right here on Jackson Avenue at the steps of St. William the Abbot after our noon Mass. To those who participated - whether walking, praying, organizing, or reverently supporting from the sidelines - thank you for being a visible witness of Christ's presence in the Eucharist. I want to acknowledge the Nassau County Police Department (thank you Commissioner Patrick Ryder!) and the detail that safely escorted the pilgrims and support team on Sunday, and throughout the week. The Diocesan and participating parish social media posts revealed the joy and reverence on the faces and hearts of so many with this testimony of faith along the way.

I also want to take a moment to reflect on the Parish Synod Listening Session held recently here at SWA. The conversations were honest, hopeful, and, I believe, Spirit-led. The feedback we received was not only thoughtful, but a clear sign of your love for this community. The most immediate hopes and recommendations revealed a strong desire for more social, playful, prayerful, and fun gatherings this summer and throughout the year – and, I want to assure you - we hear you! Stay tuned, because we have many fun, fellowship, and faith opportunities coming your way this summer - from our traditional summer Marian devotions and the Sts. Joachim and Anne celebration of grandparents to a Tuesday Summer Night Series.

Speaking of which, mark your calendars for Wednesday, June 25th, the Feast Day of Saint William the Abbot! In the wake of an incredible pilgrimage earlier this year, we will call on our patron for guidance and wisdom as we draw closer to our upcoming centennial – 100 years as a parish! We will celebrate with a Mass at 6pm followed by a parish "picnic," and I can't think of a better way to honor our namesake than with prayer, food, and fellowship together as a parish family. Bring the whole family, and perhaps reach out to a friend or neighbor who has been away from the parish – maybe because of COVID, or distractions/busyness, or maybe they have experienced loss or a hurt and have been disappointed in God or the Church. There are so many things happening that can open the door to invite people back – the Feast Day, Pentecost, or the even missionary spirit of Pope Leo XIV. Let's continue to build the Kingdom of God here in this vibrant, joy-filled community.

As we look deeper into this Pentecost weekend, please remember to lift up in prayer the Eucharistic Congress taking place at St. Anthony's High School on Sunday. Bishop Barres has called on all of us to be open to the movement God is allowing in this powerful season of the Church. May the fire of the Holy Spirit that was poured out on the early Church 2000 years ago continue to ignite hearts across Long Island. We pray that many graces come forth from the Eucharistic Procession and Congress – a sacred time of adoration, devotional prayer and learning, and Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament as the focus, the source and summit.

Have a Blessed weekend and remember - Pentecost is not just an historical event from 2000 years ago – it is happening now. The Holy Spirit is alive and active among us – that was evident here at SWA in the Easter Season, the Sacramental celebrations, the Listening Session, and all that God has in store for us this summer, and beyond. Let's continue to welcome Him into every corner of our lives and our parish. I am proud and blessed to walk this journey of faith with you – may the Spirit of the Lord God come upon us!





The arrival of the Blessed Sacrament was heralded with the peeling of our bells and was followed by an afternoon of Adoration. They then travelled to Maria Regina for a Eucharistic Revival Night and Nocturnal Adoration.

There are two Diocesan processions happening - a Nassau route and a Suffolk route. Thousands of people have witnessed this powerful procession as the the Nassau route started at St. Agnes Cathedral and, since the visit to us, has included Kellenberg Memorial High School, Chaminade High School, Holy Trinity Diocesan High School, Notre Dame Church, St. Raphael's, Holy Family Church and School - and everywhere in between! Both routes will converge this weekend at the Eucharistic Congress at St. Anthony's High School.
