

# A Time of Sacramental Firsts

We have recently journeyed through the most active time of our parish's sacramental season - the Easter Vigil, Baptisms, First Penances, First Holy Communions, Confirmation, and each weekend at least one or two weddings! The weekend of June 8th and 9th begins a return to the liturgical season of "Ordinary Time", but for us at St. William the Abbot, it is anything but ordinary. We are blessed to be celebrating the Priestly Ordination and First Mass of Fr. Joseph Lettieri, a lifelong member and son of the parish. His first Mass of Thanksgiving will be celebrated this Sunday at 2pm, an incredible gift and joy for all of us who know and love him.

A priest's first Mass is an occasion of great grace both for him and for the Church. This celebration represents the culmination of years of discernment, study, spiritual direction, and formation. It is also the beginning of what will be, we pray, many years of joyful service to the People of God. The parish has been blessed to have had men throughout the history of our 100 years step forward to serve Christ and the Church in the priesthood. All vocations ultimately come from God, and if we truly listen to his voice, he will lead us to the place that will bring us ultimate joy and happiness. But that vocation is developed and nurtured first and foremost through families. Young eyes watch how adults love God and others, in healthy marriages and families, the seeds are planted early. Vocations and sacraments are never private, they are gifts for the world. And we are grateful for Fr. Lettieri's family to have nurtured that from the start. No one knows a person's great gifts and talents and also your soft spots and "human moments" better than your family. And although we will refer to him as "Father" now, he will always be son and brother to them.

A wonderful set of traditions accompany a priest's first Mass and the days and weeks that follow. Fr. Lettieri and his classmate, Fr. Dennis Gannon, will offer individual blessings and these blessings come with special graces in the form of a plenary indulgence. A plenary indulgence is also extended to those who participate in a priest's Mass of Thanksgiving – and a priest can celebrate several of these Masses, usually in parishes and chapels to which he has a special connection, such as his home parish, pastoral year assignment, or the Seminary. You will witness a great tradition at the end of mass when Fr. Lettieri will invite his parents to come forward and extend to them their own special blessing and offer powerful gifts to them as a reminder of their offering to God one of their treasured gifts; their beloved son. As we watch Ed and Jeanne stand before their son with the rest of the Lettieri clan behind them and the image of the Holy Family statue before them, it will be a reminder how Joseph, Mary, and Jesus would go up to the Temple or into the Synagogue in the scriptures to make their prayers of praise and thanksgiving. And like Jesus, Fr. Lettieri must now enter in a new more profound way of "being in the Father's house" and doing the work of the Lord.

For priests, Ordination Weekend stirs up so many emotions and memories of their own experience. In the rectory, Fr. Michael (July 6, 2013), Fr. John (June 20, 2020), Fr. Johnson (December 31, 2001), and I (June 9, 2007) all shared stories and memories of our "big day". It's not much different than so many of you who prepared for a wedding day - the liturgy, the list of guests and invitations, and of course the great celebrations and parties afterwards brought many smiles to our faces. The response of our family members was always interesting, because as you take on this beautiful role of servant in the church and are blessed to perform these powerful faith filled actions, you are still someone's brother, or nephew, or classmate, or son. It does begin to become more real when loved ones ask you to perform a sacrament, or bless a personal item like a cross, or a house, or even bless them. The playful ribbing and the joking continues, and even sometimes playfully I might have heard a statement like: "remember I knew you when you were in middle school, don't get too big for your britches!" My favorite memory was how my dad loved to say, "I am the father of the father".

The Lord has done great things for us, and we are filled with joy! We pray in gratitude to Almighty God for Father Joseph Lettieri, and his family. We pray for those who participated in nurturing and strengthening his vocation, especially his teachers, formators, religious sisters, brothers, and priests, principals and administrators, scout leaders and coaches, encouraging SWA parishioners, and his lifelong friends. Vocations to the priesthood and religious life do not fall out of the sky or grow on trees, they come from families like yours and mine, and from parishes like St. William the Abbot. Jesus tells us in the scriptures to pray to "the Master of the Harvest for laborers in the vineyard", and so let us pray that our parish may continue to be blessed with that, strong sacramental marriages and families, and that both young women and men will rise up courageously to serve Jesus Christ in his church.




