Pillar of Formation

When you enter church for Mass, are you conscious of the way you act and/or dress? This Lenten season, be sure to wear your Sunday best (and make that a habit even after Lent).

The 10 Suggestions ???

One of the great gifts of my priesthood is celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation – to sit in the confessional and encounter individuals searching for God's Mercy. The priest who had the biggest impact on me, both as a confessor and also as a mentor priest modeling how I must receive people in the confessional, was Monsignor James McDonald. He was the Rector of the Seminary for two of the years while I was studying. He was famous for people coming from all over New York to go to him for confession. In some cases, at 1:00 AM in the morning, and he was there for them! When they did go to him, they met Jesus, and encountered the Heart of the Heavenly Father. He would always remind me, "Joe, people are nervous, for some it's been a short time since their last confession, and for others it's been many, many years. Be gentle and love them as Jesus would – do not make it difficult." To the best of my ability, I have tried to do just that.

Our first reading this weekend offers the road map or formula in order for us to examine our conscience and sinfulness during our Christian journey. It is from Chapter 20 of the Book of Exodus of how God gave Moses the 10 Commandments. These Commandments are very much a foundation of who we are as Beloved Daughters and Sons of God. They serve as guardrails and guidelines to assist us and are not "suggestions." The world and culture challenges them and asks, "why would He place such tremendous demands on us?" As believers we know it is because the Lord loves us, He wants the best for us, He wants us to become the people that he has called us to be so that we can inherit eternal life. Any relationship worth its salt has rules to live by, and when we discard them, those relationships lead to selfishness, chaos, and ultimately failure. We only need to look at marriage (56% divorce rate), family (confusion and breakdown), political leadership (crime, lies, and broken trust), and even the Church (immoral scandal).

When individuals sometimes come to the sacrament, they seem distracted and all over the place as they begin. In some cases, speaking around disordered habits, identifying faults and sins of others, or gripes within their family or the Church. But they are not actually confessing "their" sins. The Church in her wisdom offers an examination of conscience recommended before coming to confession that realistically looks at the 10 Commandments and how we may have offended or broken them. It is helpful to remember that the first three Commandments are about our relationship between us and the Lord, honoring His name, His primacy and not having false gods in our life. He also calls us to worship on the Sabbath day, which for us is Sunday (or Saturday night) – to keep holy the Sabbath, to rest from labor and mindless activities. To refrain from work/schoolwork, excessive gardening, multiple weekend sports, and other activities that separate us from being together as family and with God. This one is not a suggestion. The Lord expects us to make time for Him and honor His Day by worshiping within the faith community. Some people say, "Well, I can worship God by myself at Zach's Bay or at the beach." While that is true, there is an important dimension that we are a parish community of faith and that we are called to worship God in that community of faith. This is especially true for us Catholics as we listen to the Word of God and receive the Eucharist each week.

The other Commandments have to do with loving our parents (4th Commandment) and others (5th – 10th Commandment). We are called to respect our neighbor by revering them, by not stealing, not committing sexual sins that would use the other person. It's not just adultery but any way in which we could use another person's body for our pleasure. We are called not to be jealous, not to covet our neighbor's goods or gifts. We live in a world of great competition, where it always seems that we are looking at Facebook or Instagram and what other people have that I do not. We grasp, we crave, we can have unhealthy or unbalanced desires. God calls us in the 10 Commandments to recognize the gifts that we have and not to be jealous of the gifts of others.

May I suggest this as a Lenten practice this week; take some time to look at your Bible, and reread Exodus 20:1-17, or look online at a Catholic Examination of Conscience. To realize again these are not suggestions but commandments to remain in relationship with God and His Church. To pray for the grace to go to confession and make a good, humble confession, and to restore your friendship with the Lord. We know that Jesus' action on the cross is what forgives our sins, but He gave us this beautiful Sacrament because of our humanity that if we stumble, we can always return to Him. To meet Him in the confessional, and to be healed! I pray that your Lent continues to go well, and remember, if you have slipped up or fallen back into some of those habits that separate you from God, do not get discouraged. Come back, return to Him, and meet Him at the intersection of Mercy – on the Cross.

The Saint Peregrine Prayer Hour will be held on **Monday, March 4th** from 2:00 - 3:00 PM in the church.




Consider Automated Giving


Automated giving provides a steady stream of support. It is a great way to manage your Sunday Offerings without the worry of missing a payment and the worry of forgetting your weekly envelope.


