

As we near the close of May and prepare to enter the warmth and, hopefully, the slower pace of summer, I want to pause and reflect with you on the extraordinary month we've shared together at St. William the Abbot. The past few weekends have been filled with grace upon grace as we celebrated three weekends of First Holy Communions, which brought many of our young parishioners to the table of the Lord for the very first time. Their reverence, joy, and excitement were palpable, and they have reminded all of us what a tremendous gift the Eucharist truly is.

We also had the great joy of welcoming the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation to our parish teens. With the guidance of their parents, catechists, sponsors, and our dedicated SWS and Faith Formation team, these young men and women received the Holy Spirit to guide them on their journey of faith. Their fervently declared "I do" is a public 'yes' to Christ in the presence of their families and the community is a sign of great hope for the Catholic Church. Thank you to Mrs. Walsh, Mrs. Bradley, Ms. Abbate, Miss Spadafora, and all of our catechists and volunteers who gave of their time and love to prepare our children and teens so beautifully.

As we look ahead, we turn our hearts toward Pentecost Sunday, the birthday of the Church and a powerful renewal of the Holy Spirit present in our midst. It is no coincidence that we are also approaching the Diocesan Eucharistic Congress, an opportunity for all of us to deepen our love and devotion to the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. We will experience a small portion of the Eucharistic procession next Sunday – June 1st – following the noon Mass. If you are interested in participating in the welcome or a short time of adoration, come join us for the celebration of the Mass next week. These moments of spiritual renewal, especially in the context of the National Eucharistic Revival, remind us that we are a Church that is alive and growing.

This weekend also marks the unofficial start of summer, and with it, the observance of Memorial Day. Be sure to take time to remember and honor the brave men and women who gave their lives in service to our nation. Their sacrifice protects the freedoms we hold dear including our freedom of religion - and we owe them a debt of gratitude that can never be fully repaid. You may have participated in memorializing one of the small flags that will be placed in the gardens around the Church – I certainly did for my dad, who served in the US Army from 1955 to 1957. These flags serve as a gentle reminder that the USA remains "one nation under God"! May our prayers and remembrance bring comfort to the families of those who made the ultimate sacrifice and inspire all to live in a way worthy of their legacy.

Finally, I was wondering what Pope Leo XIV would be doing this weekend. How would he celebrate his first Memorial Day as the Pope? Maybe with a barbeque and a few Chicago bratwurst? Will he watch the Indy 500? Or the NCAA Lacrosse finals? Having a Pope from the United States of America is a remarkable sign of the universality of the Church and the role our country continues to play in Catholicism. I remember standing with great pride next to my Dad during the Memorial Day parades — how he would march with the other AMVETS and VFW units. I feel the same way when I see Pope Leo - our Spiritual Dad — I am filled with pride in our faith, our Church, and our Pope — the American Pope! Let us continue to pray for him and all Church leaders that, guided by the Holy Spirit, they may lead us with wisdom, humility, and courage.








Attendees will learn the signs of an opiate overdose, how to reverse an opiate overdose, and new treatment approaches for opioid addiction.
