The Most Holy Trinity Sunday

"In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen!" That statement is one of the most powerful prayers that has been given to us by God. We use it multiple times a day - for blessings, grace before and after meals, celebrating sacraments, and simply walking in and out of church by dipping our fingers into the holy water fonts. When we do that, of course it is a reminder of what Jesus commissions his followers to do in the Gospel this weekend: "Go, make disciples of all nations baptizing in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Over the past two weeks, I have participated first-hand or witnessed all seven sacraments of the Catholic Church hearing those powerful and transforming words. Here at St. William's, we have run the full gamut of six of the seven "sacred moments": baptisms, reconciliation, First Holy Communions, Anointing of the Sick, and I had the privilege of celebrating Confirmation this past week as well. Last Saturday I was upstate in the Diocese of Syracuse to be present at Seminarian John Brusa's Transitional Diaconate Ordination with his family and friends, and this weekend I will celebrate two weddings uniting couples and families into a deeper relationship with the Holy Trinity completing the full sacramental marathon!

As we celebrate this Holy Trinity Sunday 2024, we encounter the challenging concept of our faith experience, three 'persons' in One God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. When we dig down just a little deeper and realize the "core concept" of God leads us simply to a powerful relationship that reveals unity, communication, peace, justice, mercy, and love. The early disciples were sent on a mission to be witnesses of communion and to bring that into the world, a world often separated by sin and division. In our modern times we too can face events or conversations that pivot and lead towards division in the news, or social media, or the culture wars. What will our response be from the Church? Those who most recently received the sacraments have the ability to become the great unifiers, to help grow and transform the world into the Kingdom of God – and that is the Mission of the Church. Please pray for them!

Thank you for your support, prayers, and witness to faith.





Fr. Joe was able to participate in John's celebration and assure him of our prayers as he continues his journey towards ordination to the priesthood.








SWS Middle Schoolers participated in Mental Health Mini-Chats recently.



HEAP Cooling Assistance Open!

The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) helps people pay the cost of heating and cooling their homes. You can now apply for cooling assistance to buy and install an air conditioner or a fan for your home. To qualify you must have a documented medical condition that is aggravated by heat, and you must meet certain income guidelines.
