

"Are We in the End Times?"

Wars, earthquakes, storms, terrorism, floods, droughts, brush fires, countries aggressively overtaking each other... those are the headlines on the daily news feed - is it the apocalypse? The scriptures today also describe a daunting experience of what is to be known as the 'time of tribulation.' "The sun will be darkened, the moon will not give light, the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in heaven will be shaken." But our hope is in the "the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory." People ask me, "Fr. Joe, where is this world headed?" But the better question for us to ask is, "when the Lord calls me, where is my soul headed?" "What is my eternal destination?" We do not know the day or hour, and it is just as well, for that would be difficult knowledge to endure. But the Lord is not so gently reminding us to be ready to meet him, whenever he comes.

As a Catholic, how do we wait for the coming of the Lord? Are we prepared? Are our ducks in a row? Have we tied up all our loose ends? Have we made peace with those we are separated from? Have we made peace with God? My friends, we will have to give an account of all our actions and our omissions. The readings this weekend prepare us for the end of the liturgical season and the coming of Christ the King – the solemnity we celebrate next weekend. Before we know it, we will be celebrating Thanksgiving, the weeks of Advent, and then Christmas will be upon us. Many of us have begun the conversation with our family members and loved ones about who's hosting and what we might be bringing or making because we don't want to be surprised as the host or a guest. We make a list of the main dishes and the sides, the desserts and the beverages, the polished silverware and the fine China. No stone or crumb goes unturned.

For my family, this will be the first time in my 53 years that my father will not be sitting at the head of the table at Thanksgiving and Christmas. I am grateful for the many life lessons I learned from him as a dad, but most importantly as a man of faith. To the best of my ability, I tried to be attentive to the needs of my father, especially as he grew sicker and declined last year. I can say with great confidence that he prepared himself with the tools of the Church - his personal prayer, rosary, the celebration of the sacraments - Eucharist and confession, and the anointing of the sick. My family and I will miss him deeply and will likely have a place setting at the table to remember him. But these eschatological (end time) scriptures challenge me and force me to question how am I living my faith and preparing not just for the holidays, but for eternity?

Our vision of the 'end times' should not sink us into fear or despair at our human failures and sinfulness. We are called to an awareness and a responsibility of our soul and our loved ones entrusted to us by God. Jesus promised us that he would return and all of us will meet the King of Kings in most cases through the natural progression of a full happy life. Others we know will be called suddenly and unexpectedly. "But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." With the busy-ness of life it is easy to forget about our faith in the second coming of Christ. With the busy-ness of life it is easy to dismiss our mortality and disregard the importance of our daily and weekly choices of inviting God in. The great beauty of these Holy Days, Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas is the natural desire to offer gratitude and share gifts to God and others.

How will we prepare ourselves for the season? And for God? How will we get ready and assure that the Lord recognizes us and our loved ones? Christ the King is approaching, we all know the verse in Matthew's Gospel: "The King will say to those on His right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry, I was thirsty, a stranger, naked, ill, and in prison and you recognized and took care of me and the least of my sisters and brothers'." Let's prepare ourselves and our families for this upcoming holiday season in our faith and spiritual journey, first and foremost at the Mass. But perhaps also to attend Adult Faith Formation with Seminarian Kevin, the Saint Lucy Prayer Night, morning adoration, lighting the Advent Wreath as a family, allowing for more quiet time and prayer. Please consider supporting Parish Social Ministry, our food pantry, Christmas Adopt-a-Family, Christmas memorialization, Saint Vincent de Paul Ministry, or the needs of the school or parish in general.

God is so Good, and even when we have experienced difficulty in our parish and personal lives, our Catholic faith has both prepared us and sustained us. Today, we live in the moment. We love God and others today, which prepares us for eternity. The Gospel story may shock us, and we recognize that the trials and tribulations of life will come, but our Hope and Trust is in the Lord who made heaven and earth.






