# Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe!! Or Is He?

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King – a newer feast in the Catholic liturgical calendar which began about 100 years ago. Pope Pius XI saw a rampant and rising denial of the Lordship of Jesus Christ and felt he needed to act. The Pope attributed much of this dismissal and denial of Jesus to an increase in secularism. During the late 1800's and early 1900's there was a massive push in governments and universities to separate religion from the land - to remove God from the conversation – socially, educationally, and politically. Meaning any influence of religious belief would no longer be welcomed in the conversation of the advancement of a society. Sound familiar to our modern day? To deny the influence of Christianity in the origins of modern civilization is to rewrite a historical narrative that is just not true or accurate.

Western Civilization has grown and thrived thanks to the education, structure and advancement of intellect and reason because of the Church and Christ Jesus. The main reason for the existence of the Church is to advance the Good News – to tell the world of Salvation through Jesus. Our Catholic Faith is not an option among many other teachings and philosophies – it is the basic truth that God sent His only begotten Son into the world to save it, not condemn it. There are certainly interesting and helpful ideologies, messengers, and teachers who reveal to us certain techniques, behaviors, and ways to live. But Jesus Christ is "the way, the truth, and the life...and no one comes to the Father except through Him." John 14:6

If we were to be completely honest, can we say that Christ is the King of our lives? The King of our calendar? Our time and energy? Our bank account? The King of our computer/Netflix/Amazon account history? Our conversation about the in-laws or outlaws? Our discussions at work? As Communism and Naziism was beginning their assault on the world and the Church – Pius XI used this Solemnity to refocus the faithful – and it worked. Think of the great Saints that rose up during this time – St. Faustina, St. Maximillian Kolbe, St. Katherine Drexel, St. Pio of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio), St. Teresa of Calcutta, St. Gianna Molla, and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassatti to name only a few. Their journey towards holiness began with small steps of putting Christ first, making Him the King of the parts of their lives that were wounded and sinful. And Jesus transformed them.

The Church in 2022 has entrusted to us the next generation of potential saints. Yes, the Parish Church of St. William is called to be a seedbed of future saints that will not only impact the Catholic Church on Long Island, but the greater Church throughout the world. As I look at how the Pandemic has affected families and individuals, I believe the Lord is calling us to be that 'lighthouse of hope' here on the South Shore. But this can only happen if we place Jesus at the center and truly make Him the King of hearts and lives.

The next few weeks there are several opportunities to place God right in the center of our lives here at Saint William's. We can crown the Advent season by being a bit more intentional and making space for God. The easiest way of course is in with quiet time and prayer, at home or here for adoration before Mass. Perhaps during the season of Advent as an individual or family adding one daily Mass during the 4 weeks – and being sure that Sunday Mass is the priority. Come to Bishop Henning's or Deacon Tony's adult faith formation classes to strengthen and prepare during Advent. To commit to making (or buying) an Advent wreath or having dinner (or breakfast) and praying grace before meals each night or morning. Advent is a season of anticipation and waiting, but also a time to prepare our homes and hearts for the coming of Jesus at Christmas. We have confession and adoration each morning – let's not wait until the 4th week of Advent to go as a last-minute afterthought.

I do not intend to sound like a Scrooge, but as I drive around Seaford, Massapequa, and Wantagh, we are certainly making the time and investment to prepare our front lawns for the season. Nothing says Merry Christmas more than the scary Grinch in Santa suit, or the inflatable Sesame Street character nativity set; and who can forget the extra bright Frosty the Snowman and Peanuts characters. Obviously, those decorations can be fun and a great way to gather the family for memories and traditions, but does it express that Christ is the King of our family, household, and front lawn? Christ the King catapults us into a season and spirit of Hopeful Anticipation – Advent 2022!

This year let's not allow any distractions or excuses hold us back to support the parish, our prayerful and apostolic events, and those that we serve with our time, talent, and generosity. In the Gospel, the Good Thief asks Jesus to remember him when the Lord enters His Kingdom. We must do our part – and be sure to remember Jesus in this Season and put Him first – and let Him reign over ourselves, our families, and the parish.

Thank you for your presence, and generosity. Have a Blessed Advent!

### Welcome Deacon Steven McClernon


To the parishioners of St. William's,

I feel so lucky to be a part of your parish community as a transitional deacon. I grew up in Holbrook, with my parents, Diane and Bob, and my two siblings, Tim and Emily. I received all my sacraments from our home parish, Good Shepherd Church. After graduating from Sachem North High School, I attended both Suffolk Community College and St. Joseph's College and received a degree in child study. I taught for two years in Eastern Suffolk BOCES and Connetquot School District. After many years of discernment, I entered the seminary in 2016 and now I am about six months away from being ordained a priest.

It is very providential that I will spend my final months in seminary formation here at St. William's as there is a strong bond with Seaford. My dad's family grew up in Seaford and attended this parish; in fact, much of my extended family still attends Mass here. # Cbrstmas Adopt-a-Family Program Opens Next Week



The next meeting of the Prayer Shawl Ministry will be on Tuesday December 6th. The meeting will occur at 10am in


