Advent 2022 - A Season of Gratitude, Anticipation, and Hope

What an incredible week – we were able to celebrate a faithful disciple from the past, Anna Guardino, who served as principal of St. William the Abbot school for 24 years. Attending the celebration of Mass, the renaming of the Bus Dropoff Circle (Guardino Way), and the reception that followed were a number of priests, current and former faculty, staff, administrators, religious, and so many families affected by her wonderful leadership and faith. I am still stuffed from all the turkey, pies, fixings, and family time I partook in on Thanksgiving. God is so good! He has revealed to us his love, and even though some of us have experienced difficulty and loss over the past year - when we gather as a community of faith and put Christ at the center of it, we are able to grow in our life and faith journey.

The season of Advent is once again upon us, and St. William the Abbot is in "full preparation mode" for the birthday of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, and the Savior of the world. Yes, as soon as you entered the Church you experienced a shock to your senses - the music, the sights, and colors, and most importantly a Spirit of Hopeful Anticipation and Welcome. The Church in her wisdom desires that each one of us, her children, be ready in a spirit of prayer and wonder for the coming of the Son of God to dwell among us and IN us. For Catholics, Advent is a particular time of grace, a season of waiting, and ultimately of hope in God's promise of a Messiah. What does the Lord have in store for us and our parish family this year?

Last year, I presented a little spiritual bootcamp of ideas in the bulletin to assist us in encountering the Lord which proved to be helpful to many of you. Once again, during the four weeks of Advent the Church sets before us in the scriptures, the music, and the liturgy different ways to reveal the story of God's faithfulness and the promises to His people made so long ago, in the coming of the Messiah. Post-pandemic St. William's is ready to up our game for opportunities for spiritual growth some together, and some individually. Every year I have conversations with parishioners who often say "Father, the 'holidays' snuck up on me again and I feel like I was not prepared." Let's not let that happen this year. May I suggest a few ways to grow in your faith – and as best you can, begin today.

Similar to Lent, Advent does have a Spirit of Prayer and Abstinence – so how will we add or take away in support of our Spiritual Journey towards holiness? Perhaps it is fasting from screens – instead of sitting in different rooms of the house streaming our favorite sitcom or series – maybe we watch part of The Chosen series, or one of the newer faith-based movies (The Nativity Story, The Shepherd, Veggie Tales Christmas, or Charlie Brown Christmas). For some of us it is not just less scrolling, it is fasting from sugar, desserts, or gossip and/or complaining, sarcasm, or unnecessary buying. If you have struggled with some of these things, it is time for confession, a little clean-up of the soul before Christmas Eve. Pick a day, and maybe ask someone to come with you. Let's try to do it together, meaning – 'with' your spouse, kids, grandkids, and maybe even you and some of your SWA ministry or pew mates can try this together.

As the prophet Isaiah reminds us: "A voice cries out in the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD! Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God!" That voice is the voice of Jesus inviting us all into a deeper friendship with Him, the Father, and the Holy Spirit. The friendship and intimacy with God is present most especially during the Mass and the Sacraments. In some ways we become like Mary who prepared every cell of her being to receive Jesus. Do we do the same as we come to Mass or even into St. William to pray? We have the opportunity to allow for our hearts, our family, and our households to become spiritual mangers for the Newborn King.

This first week of Advent we call out – "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" – may we become small, so that Jesus can become big in us. The Christmas rush can become overwhelming when we focus on things that really do not matter – gifts, and stocking stuffers, and front lawn inflatable decorations - these can overshadow the real reason for the season. During Advent 2022 – these next four weeks, let's Keep Christ as the priority – the center and focus of who we are – then we will not have any excuses that Christmas snuck up on us. People get ready, Jesus is coming!! Please be assured of my prayers for you and your families. Have a blessed and Happy Advent Season. Prepare the Way of the Lord!




Thank You Toys for Tots!







