Love of God and Love of Neighbor

As Election Day 2024 approaches, I cannot help to think what a gift it is to be a citizen of the United States of America, a nation of free elections and the opportunity to express that with an individual's right to cast their vote. I, and so many of us, do that through the lens as Catholic Americans. When I think of beautiful slogans and mottos that have been a part of our American tradition like 'In God We Trust', or 'One Nation Under God', it brings a spirit of calm to my heart. I am proud to be a Catholic and an American.

The Gospel of Jesus Christ is universal, today especially we hear a call to love God and love our neighbor - it is the foundation of the Golden Rule. We acknowledge the dignity of each person as Catholic morals and principles always apply equally to all people in all places in all cultures and under all forms of government. The Gospel holds true in the most remote part of the tribal villages in the Brazilian rainforest as it does in the concrete jungle of New York City. Catholic missionaries have brought the 'Good News' from the Middle East to medieval Europe to north and south of the equator, and even here to shores of our own republic, America. The Gospel is true and effective in all settings because it transcends all of them.

Many secular humanists (those who believe that human beings are capable of being ethical without religious) argue that Christian principles are too influential in modern government and politics. Some challenge whether it is wise, or even possible, for Christians to serve in politics. Is it appropriate for a Catholic to vote precisely as a Catholic or to make political choices based primarily on Christian values and principles? I believe at times as faithful Christians we can approach secular conversations from a place of weakness or inferiority. Whether it be some of the effects of the clergy abuse scandal, or even in many cases when we are challenged on a verse of scripture or Church doctrine, or Catholic social teachings and morals that we may be less familiar with.

It would be helpful to remind ourselves that our Catholic perspective on life or marriage or immigration or the economy does not originate with a political agenda, but with Jesus Christ, the only Son of our Creator. It was God the Father who created humanity and who established the human family. He is the one who understands how it is supposed to operate, and He is the one to consult when we are seeking wisdom about how to correct the problems caused by our human brokenness – not a preferred candidate.

Catholics are encouraged to form their consciences with our rich writings and doctrine from our Church fathers and mothers who have written extensively on all topics. When we present public issues through the lens of the scriptures or the catechism or a papal document, these themes have been grappled with in many cases for centuries. We call on the Holy Spirit to aid us to understand more clearly God's wisdom and plan for the human family – if we were to be honest, can we say that we have done that over the past few months? Or has it only been consulting (whatever your flavor is) News12, FOX, BBC, CNN, or YouTube?

When I encounter people who challenge me and say: "aren't you trying to impose your views on others?" Absolutely-through the lens of Christ, the teachings of the Church, and the Gospel!!! There is so much information and misinformation that is being presented by ads, social media posts, rallies, and polling, and I can tell you the Gospel message is not a priority in those advertisements. We know the nature of the American political process is to advocate positions an individual or party believes to be right and just, attempting to persuade others of their 'rightness'. That is precisely what every political party and every interest group tries to do. In a sense, it is what every citizen tries to do every time they cast a ballot or write a letter to their congressman or president.

My friends, the American political system is based on this continual tug of war where individuals and groups 'freely' present competing points of view – which is awesome, and a fruit of our freedom. However, to attempt to silence one participant in the process as some groups are trying to do with the Catholic Church is intellectually dishonest and an attack upon our American system, and our religious liberty and freedoms. Some would argue about the separation of church and state. Many use this phrase to mean in effect, separation of moral values and public policy, however we embrace the golden rule. Some have even gone so far as to insist that any position that can be traced to a Christian teaching should be banned from any political discussion.



Well, we only need to look at the state of our world and society when we remove God, our values, and morals. We have experienced the breakdown of the family, an increase in anxiety and worry, and the opposite of the lasting peace that Jesus offers to us and our families. Separation of church and state does not mean separation of values and voting. The US Constitution does not require that when we enter the polling place this week that we check our beliefs at the door. If you have not participated in early voting yet, please pray, do your homework, and form your consciences through the lens of your faith. This will help you distinguish which candidate can best serve and protect our most fundamental rights to love God and our neighbor. How will you vote? Will it be as a Catholic?
