This week, we had the great privilege of celebrating All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day. Throughout my priesthood, and especially in my time as pastor, the All Souls' memorial mass has become one of my favorite liturgies. This mass is a time to reconnect with many families who are here week after week as they remember a loved one who passed during the previous year. It is also a time to connect with those who may not as regularly attend, but make the incredible effort to return from different parts of Long Island (and New York) back home to SWA to hear their loved one's name read. It is a powerful and emotional mass, where we not only share memories, but we also share the difficulty of missing family members. This memorial mass also unites us in being extremely hopeful in the power of God's love and the joy of the resurrection.



That message of hope has been present here at St. William the Abbot

throughout its history, and as we begin to wind down this 95th Anniversary year, it is even more important that we pause to remember all those foundational early members and the long-standing families who have helped us to survive and thrive as a parish. The Gospel this week once again reveals how the Lord continues to move, repair, and restore His faithful. We are told that "He is not the God of the dead, but of the living, for to Him all are alive," which brings us hope for our beloved dead and those who have lived and served here in the past. The scripture readings challenge us to look at the past and how the faith was practiced by our families and the first parishioners – it is nostalgic. Our Catholic faith, mass, prayer, and SWS school and religious education were priorities that would always come first. The world today, however, has shifted, and there are other activities and distractions that have become as important, or more important, to the over 5000 families who call the parish of St. William the Abbot home.

As we journey closer to Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas, my hope is that we will see that return to the practice and support of this beautiful church on the south shore of Long Island. Our mission of the sacraments, formation/education of the faithful, and the outreach to the most vulnerable will flourish and grow as we are generous with our time, talent, and treasure this Fall. The response last week to our Thanksgiving bags for Parish Outreach was amazing, and, if you are able, I ask that you please continue to be attentive to some of our needs for the food pantry and to the homebound and less fortunate as we approach the holidays. This is where St. William's has always responded to our baptismal call.

We serve a God that is alive, and we do so in this vibrant and flourishing community of SWA. I would like to close by assuring you of our overall stability as a parish. On the next page, you will again find a comparative snapshot of the parish collection, mass attendance, and participation in the Catholic Ministries Appeal. At my core, I believe that the blessings and success of a parish are not about attendance or financial generosity, but are revealed with motivated and active disciples. Let us strive to do that day-in and day-out.



Pray to Saint Martin instead of complaining when it is time to clean your room.






