"Oh, When the Saints, Come Marching In"

Last week was an opportunity for us to lift up the holy women and men who have walked on this planet and the Church has identified a sacredness in the way they lived and loved. We identify them as Saints – Happy All Saints Day! With great enthusiasm our young folks dressed in the "costumes" of the Saints and came to Mass. It was a courageous display of faith.

Those "Hallowed" individuals we emphasized embraced the path and vocation God placed before them and as best they could choose God's will each day. I was moved by a story Sister Joan of Arc shared with me about one of her former students that tied in both the Saints and vocations.

Several years ago, I read a book on the lives of the Saints identifying more obscure and less popular names. While on retreat I had mentioned the book to the Spiritual Director, who asked me how (as a result of reading this book) I would define what a Saint is? So, I used the Baltimore Catechism method of question and answer to explain it to him. That next September while working as the Librarian I chose to use that question and answer for the Saints for the bulletin board in the library at Saint William the Abbot. Each week I would put a different question and occasionally students would read and engage me in a dialogue.

Later that year, as I was reading a story to a kindergarten class and sitting in front of the bulletin board, one of the children named Christopher, raised his hand, and interrupted the story with a question. "Sister, is that true?" The question he asked had nothing to do with the story I was reading, so I asked him, "Is what true Christopher?" And he said, "What you have on the board", and he pointed. To be honest I didn't think he could even read so I asked him what does it say? And he answered – "the bulletin board says 'Q. What is a Saint? A. A Saint is one who refuses God nothing!" Then he asked me: "But Sister, how can anyone refuse God anything?" And all I could think was, thank you Christopher for challenging me to always respond to God's call!

Sister Joan of Arc's story is a reminder for all of us that as we walk toward God, and hopefully a greater personal holiness, that sanctity of life comes from several big and small "yeses". The Lord is constantly calling us out of the comfort of our small lives into the greatness He is preparing for us. When I walk around the church, I think of the faithful women and men from this parish who have risen to serve the Church in Holy Orders and Religious Life. And even today – with Joseph Lettieri, Herley Mendez, and Greg Marino in the Seminary, as well as prayers requested for Molly Lewis and Michelle DiCarlo discerning religious life.

The month of November is a time that the church in the United States sets apart to discuss the unique call to serve. At different times we addressed marriage, family, grandparents, and the sanctity of life. But it is helpful to pray for our current, past, and future vocations who will serve the church and the faithful through Holy Orders and the religious life. When we go to the root of the word vocation it comes from the Latin word 'Vocare' - meaning "to call." God calls or invites others just as He did throughout the scriptures – Abraham, Moses, Mary, Esther, Jeremiah, and Joseph. They all responded. Do you think that God is calling less people to serve Him today; or are there so many distractions that people cannot hear, or are not listening?

Through the years I have had amazing conversations at parishes, Holy Hours, school assemblies and all those who attend have said to me "we need more priests or religious – just not my child or grandchild." When I would ask them 'why,' they really did not have any answer for their children, but it was more about their own discomfort with the vocation. But remember little Christopher in Sister Joan of Arc's story, the question was so innocent and yet profound, because if God is authentically calling us, will He not provide us with joy, happiness, and fulfillment in our life? Would that we all may be Saints!

This week in a particular way, let us pray for our whole community to simply recognize and to hear God's voice calling us in this season of our life. And just like the early prophets and holy women and men of our faith we can simply respond, "Speak Lord, I come to do your will." And pray for the blessing and abundance of Religious Vocations and Holy Orders for the parish of Saint

William the Abbot!


Saint Leo the Great
