#### Altar Candles

The Altar Candles used at Mass this week have been donated in Thanksgiving to God, Jesus and Mary from Victoria Reynolds

We are called to serve the Lord and others. When we serve others, we also serve the Lord. Do something this week to put yourself at the service of others. Perhaps volunteer your time at a food pantry.

#### "Hey God: we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you."

For many people, the above statement is indicative of the type of relationship we have with God. We have all been there, we have this expectation that God is like a fast food drive-through dispenser. We pull up into the coffee shop, we read the sign, and when the barista calls out "how can I help you?", we respond: "I'll have a large, iced coffee with a splash of regular old-fashioned milk, please". Then we drive up to the window with the expectation that it is prepared exactly as we ordered it and ready for us. We make the exchange, pay for it, and then we drive away. But have you ever had the experience where you've been behind the person in the drive-through, or inside the store, and the order was not filled as the person ordered it? Maybe they put in soy milk instead of almond milk, or they asked for a mocha – frappa - zappa - ice colada, and they mistakenly received a chai herbal tea – and the customer explodes!! At that moment you observe what could be described as the worst side of humanity.

I think we all have seen those legendary YouTube videos of what can best be characterized as childish and entitled rants by people because they did not get their own way. I cannot help but cringe and pray for those employees who have been treated so poorly. But to be honest, when I think of my exchanges with God, I can have a similar disposition with the Lord, almost transactional. I expect good service, I expect my order, or prayers, to be answered in a timely manner, and in the exact way I have presented them. No diversions; packaged like a McDonald's Happy Meal. In our gospel today, the apostles James and John approach Jesus and make that interesting request – "give us whatever we ask of you". The Lord redirects and challenges them – "you do not know what you are asking. Can you drink from the chalice that I drink?" What is in the chalice that Jesus drinks? Trust me, it is not a Dunkin' or Starbucks coffee, it is a life of unconditional love, of merciful forgiveness, of sacrifice, and topped off with a little suffering on a cross.

When we turn to the Lord to give praise, or to petition, or to offer gratitude, or even to complain, all of that is prayer. And that is exactly what God wants from us, to turn to Him. Our world and lives are busy, we are pulled in so many directions - for mostly good things. Things that grab our - and our loved ones' - attention. But those things can overwhelm us when we are 'overactive' and over scheduled. When we take the time to pray, it allows us to refocus and to recenter ourselves. My friends, prayer is finding that still point that the whole of your life, and existence, and family revolves around. What really is our focus?

The responsibility I have as the spiritual shepherd of SWA is to provide space to assist you in realizing that. If we claim that Jesus is Lord of our lives but offer no time or space for Him then that statement is just not accurate. If we would look at our calendar, our bank statement, our "honey do lists", or even our screen time on our iPhone, it is there that our center and focus is. I do recognize that some of us have been disappointed or have been hurt by the Church, the parish, or specific individuals and we can form blocks or barriers and even callouses that keep us from God. But think about it, why do calluses develop? To protect something that is tender underneath.

Jesus wants to heal what is tender. Perhaps in a different season of your life you did call out to Him, you did ask for His help, you did make time for Him. Maybe it was during a tumultuous time in the relationship of your parents, or a grandparent was sick, or a child was going through the difficulties of middle school or adjusting to college. And when you went to the Lord and asked for something specific it was like the drive-through and we did not get what we wanted in the time that we asked for. None of us would give up on our favorite restaurant or retail outlet because of one or two bad experiences. But we can be so quick to move away from God and not realize that the Lord might be speaking to us in a different way or on a different timeline than we expected.

Jesus gives us the Our Father. Saint Benedict reminds us *ora et labore* ("pray and work"). Saint Augustine reminds us that in song we pray twice. Saint Teresa of Avila spent time in imaginative prayer. Saint Francis de Sales encourages us that "each person needs half an hour of prayer a day, except when we are busy, then we need a full hour". Saint Theresa of Calcutta would pray a Holy Hour each day in front of the Blessed Sacrament and simply say "Jesus, I love you, I trust you, I believe in you, and I need you". Nothing complicated, just a conversation between friends. I recently heard a beautiful image that has really stuck with me regarding traveling to work each day in a car or on the LIRR. To think of our modes of transportation as a monastic cell, not in some far-off convent or friary or monastery, but to be in the world and to invite Jesus into our busy-ness. To pray and share life and the important things with God. We are no different than James or John in the gospel, we desire many things from the Lord, but He knows what's best for us and in His time. And the only way we will know His will and His way if we make time for Him. To pray.





#### Heating Equipment Assistance Available

New York's Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) is now accepting applications for two programs that can help your household save money on your heating equipment. These are the Clean & Tune Program and the Heating Equipment Repair or Replace Program. The Clean and Tune Program offers energy efficiency services up to \$500 and can include benefits such as the cleaning of heating equipment, chimney cleaning, minor repairs, and installation of carbon monoxide detectors and/or programmable thermostats. Their goal is to allow for the safe, proper and efficient operation of your heating equipment. The Repair or Replace Program may provide up to \$4K for repairs and up to \$8K for replacement of your furnace, boiler or other heating equipment.
