## Caesar vs. God

We live in a culture that is obsessed with sports. Let's face it, after the past couple of weeks of the Jets and the Giants, the Major League Baseball playoffs, and of course the fall sports schedule for so many of our families – games, practices, and schedule – we are all in! Our Gospel this weekend shows a battle once again between Jesus and the Pharisees about priorities. We are told that the Jewish leadership was trying to trap Jesus or catch him in some sort of blasphemy against the faith establishment. They bring up the very controversial issue of whether Jews should pay taxes to Caesar when they are at the temple. The First Commandment reminds us that God must be first in all things, it is He that we worship, and He alone a person of faith's first priority. Israel was dominated for centuries by the Roman Empire, and the harsh rule of Caesar who considered himself to be a god – acknowledging that would be a sin against the First Commandment. But Jesus could not be fooled - he uses the example of the Roman coin used to pay the tax that would have Caesar's image on it. Jesus calmly says give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God were belongs to God. Priorities!

Caesar was the emperor of the whole world – and would represent the temporal and carnal things of being here on earth - power, strength, prestige, and wealth. A very different approach from how Jesus, the humble servant, would present Himself. There is the tension in our modern world and time about who do we really serve. Is it God? Or is it the things of this world? What are our priorities? The Church does not preach or teach that the things of this world are bad, God created them and so whether it be activities, sports, school, even fine dining, and vacations – they have the potential for good. But do we keep them balanced and in the right order when it comes to God? The Fall is a time when so many activities kick back up; schoolwork, travel teams, CYO, piano lessons, dance, and Faith Formation. It is a blessing to see so many families back this year, and most especially back for Mass each weekend. But where have we been? Why is there a fall off at the end of the school year and in the summer? We are encouraged to stay in that balance, giving to God what is God and Caesar what is Caesar's.

If we were to stay in that image of offering to God what is God's and to Caesar what is Caesar's, what are our priorities? Who are we giving to, and offering our best? I look at the lives of family and friends, and come back to that place of athletics - town-teams, travel-teams, school-teams - it is amazing to see the hard work and commitment that goes into all of these. I look with admiration at the time offered by so many of our parents volunteering as coaches and assistants to enhance the sport experience for their own children and others. However, it does concern me looking long-term for our parish community when the first thing that is cut from a family schedule is Mass, Faith Formation, or parish activities. Looking through the lens of my own family members, I know that my nieces and nephews would never show up late for a practice, or a game. They, for sure, would be dressed in their finest uniform, whether it be the home, away, or practice jerseys. If we go back to the image of offering to Caesar what is Caesars, and that being the carnal and temporal things of this present moment; and then giving to God His due, are we honestly offering our best? Are we putting in the same level of intensity for our eternal soul and our faith as we are for elementary, middle school, JV, or high school sports? Just something to ponder this week reflecting on the Gospel, are we giving God the scraps? Or is He our first priority?

My hope is that over the next few weeks as we offer different opportunities to gather together in prayer and worship we can refocus on the Lord and offer our very best to him. This weekend in upstate New York, there is a celebration of the New York State Eucharistic Congress, where many Catholics from our parish, our diocese, and our state will gather to pray, worship, and strategize on ways to reverence and honor the Eucharist. Tuesday night we will have Eucharistic Adoration and gather for a night of prayer and song at a candlelight vigil for peace in the Middle East and the whole world. Next Sunday will be the Milestone Anniversaries Mass for our couples who over the past few years would have celebrated a big anniversary but did not have the opportunity because of Covid to do so here in the parish. Parishioner Joseph Lettieri will be ordained a transitional Deacon for the Diocese of Rockville Centre and will serve at the altar of the Eucharist in preparation for his priestly ordination. And we will gather around another table as we joyfully celebrate our parish Golf Outing and Dinner to honor Curt Schmitt for all he and the Schmitt family have done in serving the Parish of St William in our most difficult and vulnerable times. Please join us.

As always, thank you for your presence and generosity in support of the parish.



# Senior Care Through the Office for the Aging

Did you know that the Nassau County Office for the Aging offers case managers for seniors? Their case management program provides the support for older adults to remain in their homes for as long as possible. They assist in providing in-home services for seniors through the Expanded In-home Services for the Elderly Program (EISEP). There are two types of in-home services offered, Level 1 which is housekeeping and chore services, and Level II which adds on personal care assistance such as bathing, dressing, toileting, grooming and feeding. 
