Salus Animarum Suprema Lex

The Latin expression above is from the final Canon in the book of Canon law, the salvation of souls is the supreme law. It is the responsibility of the Church to speak into the truth and to be a contradiction in the eyes of the modern world and culture. The Church has long spoken with clarity on subjects that often allows for discussion and even at times disagreement. We must realize again that we are encountering human lives and experiences, not just a "Canon," or "consequence" for actions. As humans we are given freedom, and in that freedom each day we can accept or reject God. The Lord still pursues us, and the hope is we can recognize, like the Prodigal Son, that we can ALWAYS return to the Father. Sometimes it is simply through the Sacrament of Confession, at other times we use the full tools the Church has to offer to bring us healing and salvation.

The Church recognizes the great dignity of marriage, even with the best of intentions of both partners, are not always successful. This can be true even when a family is well established, and the marriage has lasted for many years. Once a marriage is entered into by two people of faith, with a Catholic or Protestant, or even another non-Christian belief system, it is presumed to be valid and a binding union. If a marriage ends in civil divorce, and one or both partners wish to enter marriage sacramentally once again, the Church provides a judicial process to examine the validity of a particular marriage called an annulment. An examination or investigation of the history of the couple's relationship begins to determine if there were any deficiencies that prevented the marriage from coming together sacramentally at its center inception. If it can be proven with evidence that the marriage was in fact not valid, the church issues a declaration of nullity, or an annulment, and the individuals are declared free to marry.

The annulment, or "declaration of nullity/invalidity" is a statement by the church that after careful examination of the couple's relationship, did not establish a valid marriage sacramentally. It does not say that a wedding did not occur, as people still have wedding photos and videos. It does not say that the children born to the couple are less than or illegitimate. It is also NOT just a "Catholic divorce." An annulment reveals that there was an impediment or deficiency of consent, or that the intention to enter marriage was not fully and freely made. In the investigation the individuals or those who accompanied them during the first union may reveal instances that suggest nullity, such as external pressure to marry, premarital pregnancy, lack of openness to children, an unwillingness to fidelity to the spouse, grave mental illness at the moment of consent, or 'simulation' where an individual goes through the motions but truly does not want to enter marriage, to name a few.

There are other grounds that are available to assist canonists in determining whether or not the marriage was valid or not. At St. William the Abbot we are blessed to have strong advocacy that serves as a liaison between the Tribunal, the individual seeking annulment, and the priest here at the parish. The process has come to be a beautiful and healing one that allows for incredible conversations made with discretion and confidentiality. If you or someone you know may have gone through the hardship of the breakup of a relationship and may be called or feel the movement to investigate the possibility of an annulment, I encourage you to reach out to me or one of the other priests or deacons so we can begin the process, or at least begin the conversation.

There are many misconceptions about an annulment. For example, if you pay enough money (thousands of dollars) an annulment will automatically be granted. If you're a famous person (fill in the blank – famous actor, athlete, politician) an annulment will automatically be granted. Or that it can take an extremely long (10 years) or short time (6 months) for a determination. Like any process or investigation, it does take some time, whether you are famous or an unnamed saint in the pews, as the evidence is gathered and presented to the Tribunal (Church Court), which considers the proofs and renders a judgment on the petition. As a parish community, we would do everything we could to assist an individual or family to come to that place of healing. Please do not hesitate to reach out if you or someone you love have this movement in your heart, whether they are currently in a relationship that may be moving toward marriage, or not.

I wanted to address one last question that came in over the past few months regarding relationships or unions that are not recognized in the eyes of the Church. How does it affect the children of couples who are in civil unions, common law marriages, same-sex unions, or couples simply living together with children and no intention of getting married? Are the children penalized? Are they not allowed to participate in the sacraments? Not given permission to attend Faith Formation or Catholic Schools? We are always mindful that Jesus Christ is calling all of us to conversion and transformation, to enter into salvation for eternity. We must recognize that we are incomplete, and at times broken vessels who need a Savior. The innocence of a child and children in the eyes of God are just that, favored and beloved daughters, and sons. If an individual or couples decide that they desire for their child to be baptized and raised in the Catholic Church, there would be nothing that would prevent them from doing so. But one of the great things about being Catholic is when we stand before God and the community, especially at the sacraments and make a declaration, when we say AMEN, or I DO, or I WILL, the Church accepts that promise and takes us at out word. It is the responsibility of the adults to raise the children in the faith, and to live that out fully in their own lives and practice so there is no confusion. If there is something that may be blocking full participation, then we work with the ministers of the Sacraments, and the tools of the Church, to remove those blocks in order to truly Live the Faith that we profess. Remember the last Canon refocuses us always on the Salvation of Souls – it is important for us to have guidelines, laws, and rules to help us – but Salvation is the goal and destination. We are here to walk with you as companions on the journey.

I am so grateful for your presence and generosity.






