Asking the BIG Questions

As a boy I remember conversations from my parent's and grandparent's generation when inevitably the question would come up: "where were you when President Kennedy was assassinated?" It was one of those moments in American history when people could say to the minute where they were, in class, at work, or watching on TV in their home. For the next generation the same can be said about the terror attacks that occurred on September 11, 2001. All of us can pinpoint that place, thinking back on that beautiful September morning, so clear and blue were the skies – a day that began with such hope.

As we reflect on 20 years, I believe we still must ask those big questions, not only where were we, but where are we now? What is the meaning of our life's very existence? Looking through the lens of that experience, what is the impact we must have on this planet? Where was God that day? Where is He in my life today? In 2001 as a new seminarian, I just happened to be sitting in a philosophy class discerning many of those questions, and probably the most challenging one was why am I in the seminary right now? There was no overwhelming voice of God that spoke to me, but I can tell you what gave me comfort in the days and weeks that followed those terrible events. It was to be able to dialogue with God, with raw and authentic passion, anger, disappointment, and eventually hope and love. God handled all that I threw at Him – and walked with me, comforted me.

20 years later we come through the wake of a global pandemic. In many ways we have experienced similar loss once again. Not only in the loss of lives of our loved ones, but also our livelihood and in the way we have known and live our life. There are many of the similar emotions experienced during and after 9/11, and just like then, and just like always; God is here. He is not only waiting for us to come to him with our questions and every other emotion that comes from our heart, but he is pursuing us.

The challenge today, however, is very different from just 20 years ago with many more options and distractions filling our heart and mind as well as the people that we love. Just look at your calendar or schedule on your phone or hanging on the wall in your kitchen. Has there ever been so many practices, teams, activities, and opportunities to experience personal "growth" for you or your families? So many of these things can be done in person or in the convenience of a zoom meeting with the hope to be more efficient and to create more time for us. Yet we are more busy, less united as family and community, and never in the history of the world have we experience such restlessness, anxiety, and mental illness.

In the past few weeks so many of you have shared with me how St. William's parish has always been such an integral part of yours and your families lives. During the sacred moments of sacraments, prayer, and especially that it was a place to come for solace and quiet during the difficulty of what you and this community experienced 20 years ago. You have spoken to me about how the church was packed, for Sunday and daily Mass, not to mention how people showed up for the individual funerals of those who died on 9/11. To go from ground zero in downtown Manhattan to sacred ground here in Seaford. Wow.

As the Pastor of this incredible community, I desire for people to remember, and re-discover the sacredness of this holy place. To come back and remember those moments in your lives when the church was here for you - the experience of going to St. William the Abbott school; the religious sisters and priestly presence; the dedicated lay teachers and administrators; the CCD/Faith Formation classes that were both at home and in school; praying the rosary on the campus, coming to one of your family member's sacraments of baptism, confirmation, communion, weddings – will bring back beautiful and powerful memories. As well as the times that you brought a loved one here for the last time for the funeral Mass.

The world has changed much in the past 20 years, and... in the past 20 months. But asking those big questions and grappling with them to come to an answer, that never changes. I was looking at some of the questions that Jesus asked his disciples and followers, and I thought I would present them to you in this letter to ask those questions to yourself, and to really discern, what is it that you desire for you and for your family. Again, my hope is for us to "Rediscover the Sacred" that is present here and has always been present in this church community. If you or your loved ones are finding difficulty to answer these questions, then can I encourage you to come back, and see, and listen. The Lord is still speaking – take some time listen and answer:

"What are you looking for?" John 1:38.

"Can any of you by worrying add a moment to your life?" Luke 12:25.

"Do you want to be well?" John 5:6.

"What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet lose their soul?" Matthew 16:26

"What do you want me to do for you?" Luke 18:41

In thanksgiving to our first responders, military, and missionaries, let there be peace on earth! As always it is we deep gratitude I acknowledge your presence and generosity.

Faith Formation

Today we hear how it is not always easy to follow Jesus or to accept what God wants in our lives. Even Peter was told by Jesus of what was going to happen to him of how he was going to suffer, be crucified and rise on the third day. Peter felt how can Jesus be harmed in any way, since Jesus is the son of God, and he has so much love for all. Peter expressed his disapproval and Jesus knew what had to be done and that he will do what God the Father asks of him. Jesus said if you lose your life for me and for the gospel you will be saved, which means go to heaven when it is your time to leave. Things happen in our lives and now and then we do not like what is going on, and we get angry at God and ask why, and it becomes hard to do what God wants us to do. 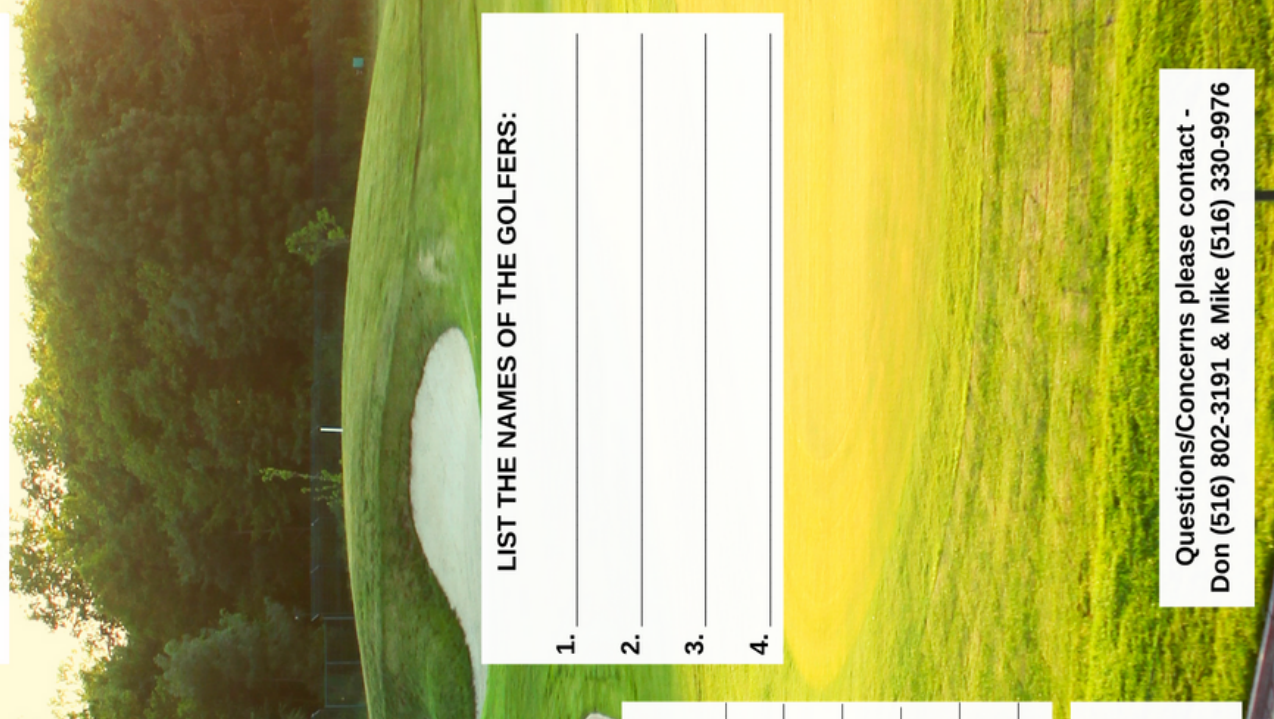

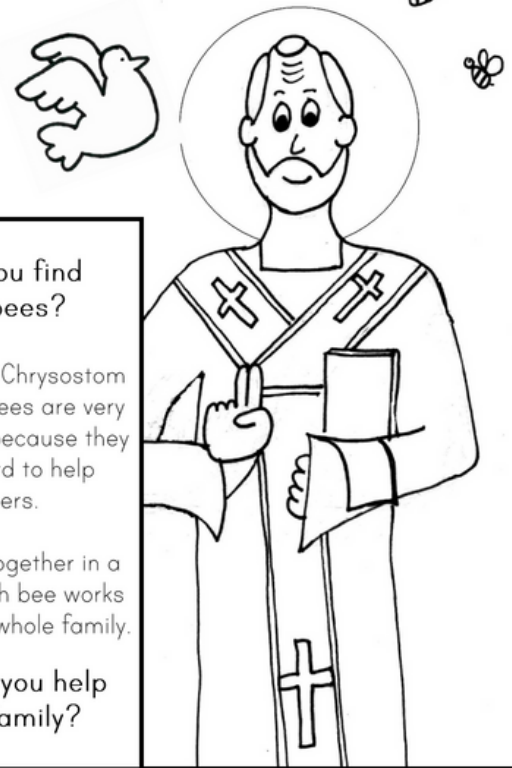

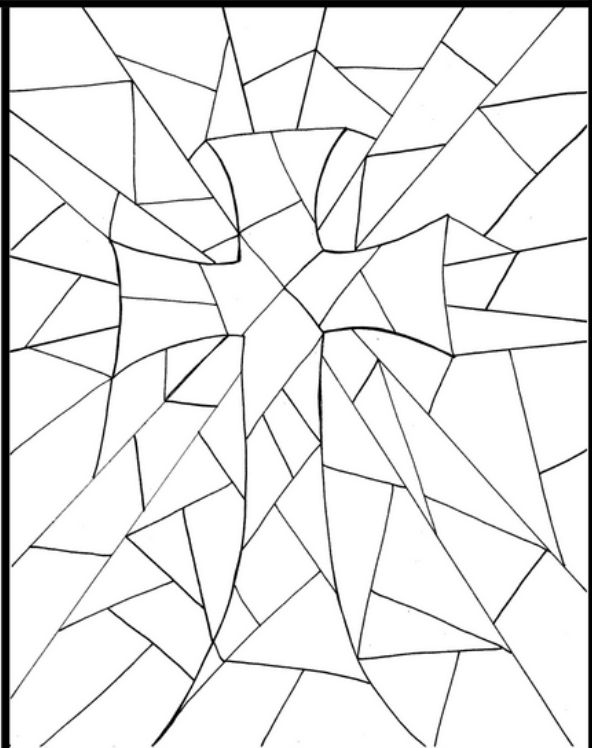
