

Who Is the Greatest?

Serena Williams, Muhammad Ali, Tom Brady, Janet Evans, Jim Thorpe, Babe Ruth, Wilma Rudolph, Pele, Bo Jackson, Billie Jean King, Mikkel Hansen.

The G.O.A.T. (Greatest of All Time) Is an expression over the years that has gained traction as we look at some of the fascinating and most amazing athletes of the modern era. During the pandemic there was a television show called “The Last Dance,” it was a documentary about Michael Jordan and his championship season of 1997-98 with the Chicago Bulls. It showed an interesting perspective through the lens of both the team and individual in arguably one of the best franchises and athletes of all time. It was a great experience to look back almost 25 years ago at a gifted human being who entertained and wowed so many of us, but it also allowed for this generation to see his excellence on the playing field. Then the argument begins, who is the greatest? It is not much different in the Gospel today, a discussion brews about who is the greatest? The debate continues.

But, in the Gospel today Jesus tries to break the cultural and social expectations and requirements that are often put-upon we humans. There is a natural desire to strive for the best, and to be the best. And we can see how the 12 disciples, and the many other followers of Jesus who are able to participate in the ministry and mission of proclaiming the Kingdom of God could look at their own gifts and talents and try to focus the spotlight on themselves. But in typical Jesus fashion, he challenges those disciples back then and us today, to take the focus off ourselves, and put it back on God.

We are told that Jesus: “took a child, and placed it in their midst, and put his arm around the child – ‘whoever receives one child such as this my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the ONE who sent me.’” I found it fascinating that Jesus chose “a child,” not a ‘boy,’ or a ‘girl,’ but a child of God. Reminding you and I that we are favored and beloved children of God, and to always look through that lens when we look at one another. Dwelling within each of us is that powerful identity. Yes, even with our brokenness and sinfulness, to come outside of ourselves and be aware of God present in others. When we see that we must live differently. When we cooperate with God’s grace and love, and then bring that into the world, our lives and the lives of others are transformed. Then the world changes.

It is so easy to get caught up in our own little world, and pretty small things can throw us off. Losing a parking spot at the mall during Christmas time, someone not using the directional signal while traveling on the Long Island roadways, when the line is long at your favorite bagel or coffee shop, or the worst, when the Internet or cable is slow or out! Oh, these first-world problems. I love to watch our young children, whether it be at the playground with my nieces and nephews, or most recently watching the children come back to school. In general, there is an awareness of the other, and in most cases if the child is focused, patient, kind, and a good sharer, it usually goes back to the old saying, ‘the apple does not fall far from the tree.’ The opposite is true as well.

I believe Jesus brought that child into the midst of all the disciples as a reminder for all of us to return to the innocence, awe, and wonder that was so present when we were children. You have heard us speak about Re-discovering the Sacred. When children walk into our church, they still look up at the stained-glass windows, the candles, the statues, and even the beauty of the roof – saying “it looks like an upside-down boat, Father Joe.” The children are looking at us to lead them, and Jesus reminds us in the Gospel to return to the Sacred, to return to a simpler and more innocent time; and to remember that we are seen, known, and loved by God.

I encourage to put yourselves in the Gospel and to think about this. Obviously the 12 were adults and following Jesus, but how was it that there was a child there? I can only imagine that there were other families, and couples, and their children who were followers of Jesus. Which means they brought their children to the Lord; it was a priority. The last time I checked you can’t get a license until you are 17 or 18 years old. Our children are involved in many activities, good activities, like sports, music and dance, martial arts, and gymnastics. The kids are not walking by themselves to the gyms, fields, studios, and playgrounds. I often hear parents say how hectic and crazy their schedules are from driving to all these activities. I find it heroic and inspiring how dedicated you all are for your children and their activities. But maybe we can think about those families and parents in the Gospel who were wise, loved their children’s soul and future so much that they brought them to Jesus. It was there that Jesus affirmed the children, loved the children, calmed their hearts. Is that not what we desire for our kids and ourselves? To hear you are Beloved, the Greatest. But WE must make JESUS the focus and priority.

The list of athletes presented above is impressive in the world of sports. But at some point, those names either stepped off the field of play, or will do that soon. And then what? The debates will continue, the talk shows, the articles, and podcasts; all trying to identify who is the GOAT. Jesus shows us another way. When you stay in the gaze of the Heavenly Father, we are seen, loved, and remembered. The Hall of Fame buildings in Canton OH, Cooperstown, NY, or Springfield, MA, will all go away one day, but our Hall of Fame, HEAVEN will last forever. Jesus reveals to us the way to greatness is to enter and to remain in His midst – as a child of God.

Fellowship Tent of Meeting

In Exodus 33:7-11, the intimate prayer of Moses with God is described. A designated place for prayer, a "tent of meeting," was set up outside of the Israelite camp. As Moses would enter this tent, a "column of cloud" would descend upon it, signaling the presence of the Lord, to whom Moses would then speak "face to face, as one man speaks to another." With their intercessor standing before God, the Israelites would then begin to pray "at the entrance of their own tents."

We will begin to extend the opportunity to come together after selected Masses each weekend just as the Israelites did with a Fellowship Meeting Tent. The Fellowship Meeting Tent will take place at two selected Masses each weekend. The selected Masses will be announced in future bulletins and our social media. 
Follow the dots to draw a Monstrance. A monstrance is a special place to hold the Eucharist.
