Building the Tower and Carrying the Cross

I know this may sound cliché, and I also know that I am beginning to sound more and more like my parents, but I cannot believe how quickly the summer went by. It seemed like only yesterday we were walking through the graduations and moving up ceremonies, the beginning of summer camps and summer jobs, and enjoying the incredible gift of summer on Long Island. With that being said, I am still feeling the effects and graces of my trip to Spain - the preparation, the travel, the actual walk, and the wonderful prayer experience. As Fall begins, and the family demands and life expectations shift, I want to encourage you to keep an eye out for ministry, prayer, and social activities here in the parish. You will be hearing from some of our ministry leaders as we get ready to kick off the choir, OCIA, Family Faith Formation, as well as spiritual and social fun opportunities. Next Monday, September 15th we will have our Golf Outing, if you have not done so already, please consider participating in the golf, but also the dinner reception.

As we dive back into the readings this weekend, the Gospel of Luke presents us with a sobering and powerful challenge from Jesus about the expectation of a disciple. He reminds His disciples that following Him is not a casual choice but a radical commitment that can lead to conflict in the world and our families. To walk in His footsteps, He says, requires carrying our cross and preparing our hearts and lives for the journey ahead. These words are not meant to discourage us, but to strengthen us, to sharpen our focus as His followers, and to remind us that the path to eternal life is not built on comfort, but on courage and faith.

Jesus tells us to carry our own cross, and each of us has been entrusted with our own unique one. That may include a financial difficulty, sickness or suffering, or a trial that shapes us in our faith and relationship with God. If you are like me, sometimes I am tempted to compare my struggle to others, and to be honest, I can wish away the particular challenges that God has placed in my life. The cross is not punishment; it is a way for us to be united to Jesus, who bore His cross with love for us. When we accept our cross, we discover that we really do not carry it alone - He carries it with us, and in Him – what appears to be our weakness becomes our strength.

Jesus also reminds us to prepare wisely for the path of discipleship. He uses the image of a builder who first calculates the cost before beginning a tower, and of a king who carefully assesses his resources before entering into battle. These examples point to the reality that our life of faith requires planning, discipline, and readiness. Just as no builder would begin a project without a solid foundation, and no leader would send troops into battle without supplies, we cannot live as disciples if our lives are scattered, distracted, or unprepared. Daily prayer, the celebration of the sacraments, and ongoing formation in faith are the tools and resources we need to build up our faith. As I walked the Camino each day, I had to prepare my backpack, fill up the water bottles, grab a granola bar or a banana, and look at the map. Otherwise, I could get lost, run out of energy, or become dehydrated.

In many ways, our lives resemble both the tower, or the battle, or the Camino Walk. We are building something far greater than brick and stone—we are constructing our families, our parish community, and our own relationship with Christ. At the same time, we are engaged in a spiritual battle. The Evil One is relentless, seeking to pick apart our families, weaken our faith, and distort our culture. If we are not equipped - if our children are not formed, if our marriages are not rooted in prayer, if our parish is not united in Christ - then we are vulnerable and may complete the task God has placed before us.

And yet, our hope is found in the cross of Christ. What seems like defeat to the world is in fact victory for those who believe in and embrace it. On Calvary, Jesus triumphed over sin, evil, and death, showing us the "WAY" that leads to eternal life. He calls us to follow Him, not in fear, but in confidence, knowing that His victory is our victory. If we take up our cross and prepare well, we will discover the strength and peace that comes only from our Lord – even in difficulty. So let us encourage one another in this journey to the cross, and to heaven!




Memory Café September 19




